The Indian Railways (IR) has been on a spending spree with respect to **capital expenditure (capex)**, particularly after the government merged its rail budget with the main budget.

Key points


- Its operating ratio, which is the ratio of ordinary working expenses to the gross traffic receipts, has shown no improvement.
- A lower ratio implies better profitability and surplus for capital investment.
- The problem is that the IR's freight segment is profitable whereas the passenger segment makes huge losses.


Did you know?

The **11 commodities** in the IR's transport basket **account for 90%** of tonnage and revenue, of which coal is around 45% and iron ore and cement are around 10% each.

About NAFIS

- Police across States have been trained to record finger impressions through the National Automated Fingerprint Identification System (NAFIS).
- NAFIS is under the NCRB
- It is a separate project that was launched in 2022.
- It assigns a unique ten-digit National Fingerprint Number (NFN) to all suspects arrested by the police.
- State police have their own fingerprint database.
- NAFIS integrates the data on a common platform, enabling the police to run a countrywide search to match fingerprint impressions lifted from a crime scene.

About Sensex The benchmark index of the Bombay Stock Exchange in India is known as the Sensex. The Sensex Index comprises 30 of the BSE's largest and most actively traded stocks, and it serves as a barometer for the Indian economy. It is market capitalization-weighted and float-adjusted. The Sensex is re-evaluated two times a year, one in June and the next in December. It is the oldest stock index, established in 1986 by one of the leading index producers, Standard & Poor's (S&P) in India. The Sensex was used by analysts and investors to track India's economic cycles as well as the growth and decline of specific sectors.

- The award jury considers all genres of writing, including poetry, fiction, drama, non-fiction, and criticism.

30k families in Kerala shrug off 'extremely poor' status	In News: • Six-and-a-half decades after its formation, Kerala achieved a major milestone towards ensuring zero poverty with the government declaring that nearly half of the 64,006 families identified as 'extremely poor' in the state have moved up in status.
	 Key Points: The status report brought out by the local self-government department (LSGD) said 30,658, or 47.89%, of the 64,006 families moved out of poverty in the first phase. Now, the state has around 33,000 extremely poor families, with multidimensional poverty at 0.55%. As per the report, the state plans to uplift 26,547 of the remaining families by next November to attain 90% extreme poverty eradication and make it zero by November 2025.
