- Purpose: The BNSS Bill, 2023, is intended to replace the existing Code of Criminal Procedure (CrPC).
- Immunity to Armed Forces: It provides additional immunity to armed forces personnel.
- Sanction for Legal Action: The bill stipulates that no case can be registered against armed forces personnel without the sanction of the Union or State government for acts performed in the line of duty.
- Relation to AFSPA: This provision is in addition to the Armed Forces Special Powers Act (AFSPA), which already grants significant powers to armed forces in disturbed areas.
- AFSPA Powers: Under AFSPA, armed forces have the authority to arrest or kill individuals contravening the law, conduct warrantless searches, and are protected from prosecution and legal suits without the Central government's sanction.
- AFSPA Application: Currently, AFSPA is applicable in parts of Assam, Arunachal Pradesh, Nagaland, Manipur, and the entirety of Jammu and Kashmir.

India-Middle East-Europe Economic **Corridor (IMEC) Project**

Key points:


Components: The IMEC will include Railroad. Ship-to-Rail networks, and Road transport routes.

- The Northern Corridor: Connecting the Gulf to Europe.

Additional Infrastructure: The corridor will also encompass an electricity cable, a hydrogen pipeline, and a high-speed data cable.

Goals:

- To establish a comprehensive transportation network combining rail, road, and sea routes.
- To connect India, the Middle East, and Europe.
- To enhance transportation efficiency and reduce costs.
- To increase economic unity and generate employment.
- To reduce Greenhouse Gas (GHG) emissions.

Expected Impact: The IMEC is anticipated to transform the integration of Asia, Europe, and the Middle East by bolstering trade and connectivity.

Greenhouse gases hit record high in 2022

Context

- The United Nations warned that Greenhouse gas concentrations in the atmosphere hit new record highs in 2022, with no end in sight to the rising trend
- The UN's World Meteorological Organization said levels of the three main greenhouse gases — the climate-warming carbon dioxide, methane and nitrous oxide — all broke records last year.

Key points

 The 2015 Paris Agreement saw countries agree to cap global warming at "well below" 2° C above average levels measured between 1850 and 1900 — and 1.5° C if possible.

	 It also consists of a large 39-foot stationary antenna reflector made of a gold-plated wire mesh which will be used to focus "the radar signals emitted and received by the upward-facing feed on the instrument structure. It will measure Earth's changing ecosystems, dynamic surfaces, and ice masses, providing information about biomass, natural hazards, sea level rise, and groundwater. NISAR will observe Earth's land and ice-covered surfaces globally with 12-day regularity on ascending and descending passes.

First Che International Chess Festival

Context:

Expansion of Water Metro Operations to Ashtamudi Lake



Context:

- Buoyed by the success in Kochi, the Water Metro is considering expanding its operations to Ashtamudi lake, following a request from Kollam Corporation.
- The National Transportation Planning and Research Centre (Natpac) officials have identified three potential routes for the ferry service: Munroe Island, Alappuzha, and Varkala.

Key Points:

- A pre-feasibility study conducted in collaboration with Natpac and Water Metro officials supports the suitability of Ashtamudi lake for the service.
- The proposed first phase is between Kollam Boat Jetty and Munroe Island.
- The Water Metro aims to attract tourists and enhance **connectivity to Kundra IT park** and nearby panchayats.
- Ashtamudi lake is considered conducive for the service due to its natural depth, pollution-free environment, and calm waters.
