	<ul> <li>India and the United Kingdom signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) for a bilateral international cadet exchange programme and a Letter of Arrangement (LoA) on defence collaboration in research and development.</li> <li>The LoA on R&amp;D was signed between the Defence Research and Development Organisation and the U.K.'s Defence Science and Technology Laboratory.</li> </ul>
Sisal leaves	<ul> <li>Context <ul> <li>Scientists at Stanford University are researching the use of sisal leaves to create a highly absorbent material that could replace cotton, wood pulp, and chemical absorbents in sanitary napkins.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key points <ul> <li>The absorption capacity of the sisal-based material is reported to be higher than that in commercial menstrual pads.</li> <li>The method developed by the researchers involves using a decorticator to mechanically separate the fibres from sisal leaves and employing a process inspired by termite guts to delignify the fibres.</li> <li>The study claims that the process uses no polluting or toxic chemicals and can be conducted on a small scale, making it environmentally sustainable.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
Chhattisgarh govt. launches scheme for Ayodhya visit	<ul> <li>Context <ul> <li>Chhattisgarh has approved its Ram Lala Darshan (Ayodhya Dham) Yojana.</li> <li>Under the scheme, 20,000 eligible residents of the State would be taken to the holy city for pilgrimage every year.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

'Minorities' right to open institutions	<b>Context</b> The Supreme Court observed that the right given to religious and linguistic minorities to establish and administer their own educational institutions under <b>Article</b> <b>30(1) of the Constitution</b> was not intended to "ghettoize" them.
	<ul> <li>Key points         <ul> <li>The minority character of an educational institution is not lost if its founders, who belong to a particular minority community, chose administrators from other communities, including the majority group, to run the institution</li> <li>Article 30 does not mandate that the administration of a minority educational institution should be only by members of that community</li> <li>The provision confers on the minority the discretion to choose the administrators of the institution.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

<image/>	<ul> <li>Context: The Sree Padmanabhaswamy temple in the state capital plans to present an 'Onavillu,' a traditional ceremonial bow, to the Lord Ram temple in Ayodhya as a gift on Jan 22.</li> <li>Key Points: <ul> <li>The 'Onavillu' will be transported to Ayodhya on a flight from Kochi.</li> <li>The tradition of consecrating 'Onavillu' at the temple dates back to the 16th century.</li> <li>The 'Onavillu' is a painted wooden bow depicting Ananthasayanam, Dasavatharam, Sreerama Pattabhishekam, and Sreekrishnaleela with micro-perfection using natural colors.</li> <li>The process involves a 41-day penance by members of the Viswakarma community, known after Lord Viswakarma, who traditionally prepare the Onavillu.</li> <li>Different versions of Onavillu are consecrated to different deities, such as Lord Padmanabha, Lord Narasimha, Lord Krishna, and Lord Rama.</li> <li>The Onavillu is offered to the respective deity on Onam day and removed on the third day after Onam.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
