This day marks the anniversary of the adoption of the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands in 1971 in Ramsar, Iran, an international treaty aimed at conserving and sustainably using wetlands around the world. India is also the part of Ramsar Convention and is one of the most active players in the group. Recently, the number of wetlands in India grew from 75 to 80.

- The state of Tamil Nadu (14) has the most Ramsar sites in India, followed by the state of Uttar Pradesh with 10 sites.
- India currently has 80 sites designated as Wetlands of International Importance (Ramsar Sites).

CET bags patent for smart helmet technology	 The College of Engineering Thiruvananthapuram (CET) in India has successfully obtained a patent for its groundbreaking smart helmet technology. Three former students, Athira U.V., Athira Resmi N., and Athira A. of the 2016 Electronics and Communication Engineering (ECE) batch, have been credited with the innovation. This invention aims to significantly improve motorcycle rider safety by incorporating two key features: Alcohol Detection Unit: Embedded within the helmet is a sensor capable of detecting the presence of alcohol. If the rider's breath exceeds a predetermined Blood Alcohol Content (BAC) limit, the system triggers several safety measures like Vehicle Immobilization and Alert Signals RF-Based Communication The helmet integrates an RF communication module that transmits a unique identification signal to nearby law enforcement devices.
Record allocation of ₹2,744 crore for rail infra enhancement works in Kerala	 The Union Budget 2024-25 allocated a historic ₹2,744 crore for railway infrastructure improvements in Kerala, marking a sevenfold increase over the average outlay of the previous government. This significant investment prioritizes line doubling projects, with ₹1,072.5 crore earmarked for this purpose. Specific allocations include: ₹105 crore for Ernakulam-Kumbalam (7.71 km) doubling. ₹102.50 crore for Kumbalam-Turavur (15.59 km) doubling. ₹500 crore for Turavur-Ambalappuzha (50 km) doubling.
