Women, Business and Law Index	<ul> <li>Context: India has improved its ranking to 113 out of 190 countries in the World Bank's Women, Business and Law index.</li> <li>Key points: <ul> <li>The index, which measures the enabling environment for women's economic opportunity in 190 economies, assesses how laws and regulations impact women's economic rights on a scale of 0 to 100, where 100 signifies equal legal rights for men and women.</li> <li>The report evaluates eight key areas: Mobility, workplace, pay, marriage, parenthood, entrepreneurship, assets, and pension.</li> <li>This is the 10th edition of the report.</li> <li>Globally, no country achieved a perfect score, indicating a lack of equal rights for women worldwide.</li> <li>Indian women enjoy 60% of the legal rights given to men, which is lower than the global average of 64.2%.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
<image/>	<ul> <li>Context: Prime Minister Narendra Modi visited the Kalpakkam nuclear power plant and observed the commencement of "core loading" at India's first indigenous Fast Breeder Reactor (500 MWe).</li> <li>Key points: <ul> <li>In 2003, the government approved the creation of Bhartiya Nabhikiya Vidyut Nigam Ltd. (BHAVINI) to operate India's most advanced nuclear reactor, the Prototype Fast Breeder Reactor (PFBR).</li> <li>The PFBR, fully designed and constructed indigenously by BHAVINI with contributions from 200 Indian industries, is a significant achievement.</li> <li>Once commissioned, India will be the second country, after Russia, to have a commercial operating Fast Breeder Reactor.</li> <li>The PFBR is an advanced third-generation reactor with inherent passive safety features,</li> </ul> </li> </ul>









	ensuring high levels of safety.
	<ul> <li>PFBR:</li> <li>The PFBR, which breeds more material for nuclear fission than it consumes, is a key project of India's nuclear power programme.</li> <li>Initially, the reactor will use uranium-plutonium mixed oxide (MOX) fuel.</li> <li>The uranium-238 'blanket' surrounding the fuel core will undergo nuclear transmutation to produce more fuel, earning the name 'Breeder'.</li> <li>The use of Thorium-232 as a blanket is also envisaged.</li> <li>Through transmutation, Thorium will create fissile Uranium-233 for use as fuel in the third stage.</li> <li>FBR is a stepping stone for the third stage, leading to the full utilization of India's abundant thorium reserves.</li> <li>After core loading, the reactor will approach criticality, generating power subsequently. PFBRs are cooled by liquid sodium, with 1,750 tonnes of liquid sodium to be loaded into the reactor.</li> <li>India chose the closed fuel cycle option for this reactor, where spent fuel is reprocessed and converted into indigenously-developed unique plutonium-rich mixed carbide fuel.</li> </ul>
<image/>	<ul> <li>Context: <ul> <li>Russia recently conducted a fire test of its nuclear ballistic Yars missile.</li> </ul> </li> <li>Key points: <ul> <li>The RS-24 Yars is an intercontinental ballistic missile (ICBM) in Russia's Strategic Missile Forces arsenal.</li> <li>It has an operational range of up to 12,000 kilometers, making it one of the longest-range missiles globally.</li> <li>The RS-24 Yars features a Multiple Independently targetable Reentry Vehicle (MIRV) system.</li> <li>This allows it to carry multiple nuclear warheads, enhancing its strategic deterrence capability.</li> <li>The RS-24 Yars replaces the older Topol and Topol-M missile systems.</li> <li>It exists in both mobile and silo-based forms to increase flexibility and reliability.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>ICBM:</li> <li>An intercontinental ballistic missile is a ballistic missile with a range greater than 5,500 kilometres, primarily designed for nuclear weapons delivery.</li> <li>Maximum range varies from 7,000 to 16,000 kilometers, according to the Federation of American Scientists.</li> <li>Compared to other types of ballistic missiles, ICBMs are significantly faster and have a greater range.</li> <li>Agni-V, an Indian ICBM, has a range of over 5,000 kilometers.</li> </ul>
Narasapur crochet lace         Image: Second secon	<ul> <li>Context:</li> <li>The Narasapur crochet lace craft, famous in the Godavari region of Andhra Pradesh, has received the Geographical Indications (GI) tag from DPIIT.</li> <li>The GI tag aims to revive the craft and boost its demand, especially against competition from machine-made lace products from China.</li> <li>Key points: <ul> <li>Originated in 1844 when Macrae and his wife from Scotland taught the lace-making technique to local women at Dummugudem, Telangana.</li> <li>The craft is limited to 19 mandals in West Godavari and Dr. B.R. Ambedkar Konaseema districts in the Godavari region.</li> <li>Major trade points include Narsapur, Palacole, Razole, and Amalapuram, involving around 15,000 women in production.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

Tripura's traditional tribal attire 'risa' receives GI tag	<b>Context:</b> After a year of Tripura's queen pineapple receiving the GI tag, 'risa,' a traditional tribal attire, has also been granted the GI recognition, as announced by Chief Minister Dr. Manik Saha in Agartala.
	<ul> <li>Historical Significance:</li> <li>The attire is claimed to have originated before the Manikya kings' rule over Tripura, which lasted over 500 years starting from the 15th century.</li> <li>Maharaj Trilochana, also known as Subhrai Raja, is said to have invented nearly 250 designs of 'rignai' during his time for his 250 wives.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Features of Tripura's Traditional Attire:</li> <li>The traditional Tripuri female attire consists of three parts: 'risa,' 'rignai,' and 'rikutu.'</li> <li>'Risa' is a handwoven cloth used as a female upper garment, headgear, stole, or a present to express respect. It is wrapped around the torso twice.</li> <li>'Rignai' is primarily worn as the lower garment, similar to the sari of mainland India.</li> <li>'Rikutu' is mainly used as a wrap, 'chunri,' or 'pallu' of the Indian saree, also used to cover the heads of newly married Tripuri women.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Cultural and Religious Significance:</li> <li>'Risa' is worn in religious festivals such as Garia Puja by tribal communities and as a turban by men during weddings and festivals.</li> <li>Adolescent Tripuri girls are first given a 'risa' to wear in an event called Risa Sormani, at ages 12 to 14.</li> <li>The cloth is also used as a makeshift hanger to hold an infant on mothers' backs and is presented as a mark of honor to distinguished recipients.</li> <li>'Risa' is common in almost all 19 indigenous tribal communities of Tripura, with each community having its own design.</li> </ul>

Nilgiri Tahrs spotted for first time at Chimmony sanctuary         Image: State of the stat	<ul> <li>Context: <ul> <li>Two Nilgiri Tahrs were spotted at Chimmony Wildlife Sanctuary in the district for the first time</li> <li>This discovery raises hopes for the conservation of this species as it indicates an extension of their habitat range.</li> </ul> </li> <li>About: <ul> <li>Total population of the Tahr does not exceed 2,000 at present and a conservative estimate would place the numbers within the 1,800-2,000 range (IUCN)</li> </ul> </li> <li>Did you Know? <ul> <li>Among 12 ungulate (hoofed mammal) species found in India, the Nilgiri Tahr is the only mountain dweller found in Southern India.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>

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

Over 73,000 names newly added to voters' list in Thiruvananthapuram district	<ul> <li>Context:</li> <li>A total of 73,330 individuals have been newly added to the voters' list in the district since July 21, 2023.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>About: <ul> <li>As per the latest figures, the district has 27,82,800 voters including 13,20,017 women, 14,62,691 men and 92 transgender voters.</li> <li>The list includes 25,416 persons with disabilities, 28,598 young voters, and 78,032 voters aged above 80. Thiruvananthapuram district has 2,730 polling booths.</li> <li>Also, 65,342 names have been removed from the list.</li> <li>This includes deceased voters, duplication of names, people who have moved away and absentee voters</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
