Sea anemone



Why in news?

- Scientists at the ICAR-National Bureau of Fish Genetic Resources (NBFGR) are working on sea anemones in the Lakshadweep group of islands.
- They have observed mass anemone bleaching off the Agatti island.
- While coral bleaching is not new in Lakshadweep, this is the first time sea anemone bleaching has been observed in these islands.

About Sea anemone:

- Sea anemones are invertebrate aquatic animals with soft bodies and the ability to sting.
- They belong to the **phylum Cnidaria** and are **ocean-dwelling creatures**.
- They have a sticky foot or disc that allows them to anchor to rocks on the sea bottom or on coral reefs.
- They are known to form symbiotic relationships with other animals, the most well-known alliance being with clownfish.









Places in news: Panama



Why in news?

- Panama is on the verge of a significant change to its immigration policy.
- This change could have effects from the dense Darien jungle to the U.S. border.

About Panama:

- Panama is a country in Central America, located on the Isthmus of Panama, the narrow bridge of land that connects North and South America.
- It is bordered by Costa Rica and Colombia and is situated between the Caribbean Sea and the North Pacific Ocean.
- Panama is renowned as the site of the **Panama** Canal, which cuts through its midsection.
- Panama has the largest rainforest in the Western Hemisphere outside the Amazon Basin.
- Capital: Panama City.







United Forum **Nations** on **Forests**



Why in news?

- The 19th Session of the United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF19) took place from May 6-10, 2024 in New York, United States.
- By the end of the forum on May 10, the declaration aimed to achieve agreement on a high-level political commitment to forest protection.
- The declaration included **specific actions for** effective implementation of the UN Strategic Plan for Forests (UNSPF) by UNFF and its stakeholders.

About United Nations Forum on Forests:


- The United Nations Forum on Forests (UNFF) was established in 2000 by the UN Economic and Social Council (ECOSOC).
- The UNFF promotes the management, conservation, and sustainable development of all types of forests.
- The forum has **universal membership** and is composed of all Member States of the United Nations and specialized agencies.
- The UNFF meets annually at the UN Headquarters in New York for high-level dialogue on technical matters in odd years and policy matters in even years.
- India is a founding member of UNFF.







T cells



Why in news?

- A new clinical trial has been conducted on the performance of infusions of immune-calming regulatory T cells for children with type 1 diabetes.
- The trial shows that a **single dose of these** cells can be efficiently transferred in children.
- However, the trial does not show signs of preserving insulin-releasing cells in the pancreas.

About T cells:

- T cells, also known as T lymphocytes or thymocytes, are a type of white blood cell.
- They are part of the immune system and develop from stem cells in the bone marrow.
- T cells help protect the body from infection and may help fight cancer.
- There are two main types of T cells: Cytotoxic T-cells, which destroy infected cells, and Helper T-cells, which send signals that direct other immune cells to fight infection.
- T cells circulate until they encounter their specific antigen, rather than generically attacking any antigens.
- When a T-cell receptor fits with its viral antigen on an infected cell, the Killer T-cell releases cytotoxins to kill that cell.










The exoplanet 55 Cancri e



Why in news?

- Astronomers have finally located a rocky planet with an atmosphere.
- But it appears to have a surface of molten rock and offers no hope for habitability.

Key points:

- The planet is described as a "super-Earth", a rocky world significantly larger than Earth but smaller than Neptune.
- It orbits close to a star that is dimmer and slightly less massive than the sun, completing an orbit every 18 hours or so.

About 55 Cancri e:

- The planet, also known as **Janssen**, is an exoplanet and a super-Earth located about 41 light-years from Earth in the constellation Cancer.
- Its surface temperature is about 3,140 degrees Fahrenheit.
- The planet is probably tidally locked, meaning it perpetually has the same side facing its star, similar to how the moon faces Earth.



Hepatitis



Why in news?

- On May 12, health authorities in Malappuram issued a fresh warning against the spread of hepatitis.
- This warning was issued in response to two more deaths reported in the last two days.

About Hepatitis:

- Hepatitis refers to inflammation of the liver, which can be caused by viruses, toxins, alcohol, certain drugs, and autoimmune conditions.
- Types of Viral Hepatitis: The most common types are Hepatitis A, B, C, D, and E.
 - Hepatitis A: Transmitted primarily through ingestion of contaminated food or water.
 - **Hepatitis B**: Transmitted through contact with infected bodily fluids, such as blood, semen, and vaginal fluids.
 - Hepatitis C: Mainly spread through blood-to-blood contact, such as sharing needles or from inadequately sterilized medical equipment.
 - Hepatitis D: Occurs only among those infected with Hepatitis B, as is a superinfection.
 - o Hepatitis E: Generally transmitted through consuming contaminated water and prevalent in regions with poor sanitation.

Why in news?

- 50 Kudumbashree women farmers are set to learn how to use drones in their fields.
- The Kudumbashree Mission, the Indian Council of Agricultural Research, and the Central Tuber Crops Research Institute (CTCRI) will jointly organise a four-day training.
- The training will focus on the use of drones in agriculture.

About Kudumbashree Mission:

- The **Kudumbashree Mission**, officially known as the **Eradication** Mission. State Povertv established by the Government of Kerala in 1998.
- aims to eradicate poverty through community-driven initiatives that empower women and promote self-help groups.
- Kudumbashree operates through a three-tier system composed of Neighbourhood Groups (NHGs), Area Development Societies (ADS), and Community Development Societies (CDS).
- mission has established over 49,200 microenterprises that engage in various sectors such as catering, waste management, and more.
- It has been pivotal in mobilizing savings and providing credit to its members, thereby fostering economic independence and stability among women.

About Swami Chinmayananda: Swami Chinmayananda Saraswati, born as Balakrishna Menon on May 8, 1916, was a renowned Hindu spiritual leader and teacher. He founded the Chinmaya Mission in 1951, a worldwide non profit organisation, to spread the |

Through the Mission, Chinmayananda spearheaded a global Hindu spiritual and cultural renaissance that popularised these spiritual texts and values, teaching them in English all across India and abroad. He was originally a journalist and participated in the Indian independence movement. |

| Shri Thrikkaipatta Mahakshetram | Why in news? The project is underway to restore the Shri Thrikkaipatta Mahakshetram, one of the oldest temples in India. The temple, more than 1,500 years old, is being reconstructed in a unique apsidal shape (Gajaprishta), making it the largest sreekovil in the state dedicated to Lord Subrahmanya. |
| | About Shri Thrikkaipatta Mahakshetram: The temple features the largest Lord Subrahmannia Sreekovil in Kerala, which is designed in the "Gaja Prishta" form (resembling the back of an elephant). It is situated in a geographically significant area in Kozhikode, Kerala. The region's name, Kozhikode, is thought to be derived from 'Kozhi' (cock), the flag symbol of Lord Subrahmanya, which further underscores the area's ancient ties to the deity. |
