Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C)	Why in news? ■ The Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C), in collaboration with Microsoft, has taken action against cybercrime. ■ They have blocked more than 1,000 Skype IDs that were involved in blackmail, extortion, and "digital arrests".
	 Key points: These cybercrimes were committed by individuals posing as police and law enforcement authorities. The Union Home Ministry identified this as an organised online economic crime. It was found to be operated by cross-border crime syndicates.
	 About I4C: The Indian Cyber Crime Coordination Centre (I4C) has been established under the Ministry of Home Affairs (MHA) to deal with cybercrime in a coordinated and comprehensive manner. The centre is located in New Delhi and focuses on tackling issues related to cybercrime for citizens. The I4C functions as a nodal point in the fight against cybercrime.



Wholesale Price Index (WPI)	 Why in news? Inflation in India's wholesale prices rose to a 13-month high. This increase was due to an uptick in food inflation and year-on-year rise in fuel and power prices after several months of deflation.
	 About WPI: The Wholesale Price Index (WPI) measures the changes in the prices of goods sold and traded in bulk by wholesale businesses to other businesses. The WPI is calculated and published by the Office of Economic Advisor, Department of Industrial Policy and Promotion in the Ministry of Commerce and Industry. WPI data is published monthly. Analysts use the WPI to track the supply and demand dynamics in industry, manufacturing, and construction. The base year for the new series of WPI was updated to 2011-12 from 2004-05. The WPI is calculated by taking a weighted average of the prices of a basket of goods, with each item's weight determined by its share of total wholesale sales. The basket of goods comprises three major groups: Primary Articles (Weight 22.62%), Fuel and Power (Weight 13.15%), and Manufactured Products (Weight 64.23%). The prices of a total of 697 items are tracked under the 2011-12 series of the WPI, which includes 117 primary items, 16 items of fuel and power, and 564 manufactured products. About geomagnetic storm:

- A geomagnetic storm is a major disturbance of Earth's magnetosphere.
- These storms are the result of variations in the solar
- These variations produce major changes in the plasmas, fields currents, and Earth's magnetosphere.
- The largest geomagnetic storms are associated with solar coronal mass ejections (CMEs).

About PM SHRI:

- The Pradhan Mantri Schools for Rising India (PM SHRI) is a centrally sponsored scheme by the Government of
- The scheme was approved by the Cabinet on 7 September, 2022.







	 The PM SHRI scheme aims to develop more than 14,500 schools across the country by strengthening the existing schools among those managed by the Central Government/State/UT Government/local bodies. These schools will showcase the implementation of the National Education Policy 2020. They will also offer leadership to other schools in their respective regions13. The scheme is proposed to be from 2022-23 to 2026-27. The PM SHRI Schools will provide high-quality education in an equitable, inclusive and joyful school environment. The PM SHRI Schools will be developed as Green schools, incorporating environment-friendly aspects like solar panels and LED lights, nutrition gardens with natural farming, waste management, plastic-free, water conservation and harvesting.

It enables students to open their accounts and gives multiple options for entering and leaving colleges or universities.

	 About KSWMP: KSWMP is a combination of technical and financial assistance provided to the participating Urban Local Bodies (ULBs) and strengthens the infrastructure for solid waste management. The objective of KSWMP is to enhance institutional as well as service delivery systems in urban local bodies for solid waste management. The project comprises of three components:

He was born on August 20, 1856, in Chempazhanthy, a village in Thiruvananthapuram, Kerala. He led a reform movement against the injustice in the caste-ridden society of Kerala in order to promote spiritual enlightenment and social equality. A popular quote of his is: "one caste, one religion, and one god for all human beings". He is the author of the Advaita poem Daiva Dasakam, which is one of the most used poems in Kerala for community prayer.
