### About Iberian lynx:

- Endemic Carnivore Species:
  - One of two carnivore species endemic to Europe (the other being European mink, Mustela lutreola).
  - The world's most endangered carnivore.
- **Sexually dimorphic**: males are heavier and longer than females.
- Behavior:
  - Generally nocturnal.
  - Activity patterns closely synchronized with those of their major prey, the rabbit.
- Distribution:
  - Once distributed throughout the Iberian Peninsula.
  - Now sparsely distributed in Spain and Portugal.
- Conservation Status:
  - IUCN Red List: Endangered.
  - O CITES: Appendix II.

- The specific cybercrime mentioned is **vishing**.


### **About Vishing:**

- Vishing, or "voice phishing," is a type of scam where attackers use phone calls to trick individuals into providing personal, financial, or confidential information.
- Techniques Used:
  - Caller ID Spoofing: Attackers disguise their phone number to appear as if they are calling from a legitimate source, such as a bank or government agency.
  - Pretexting: Scammers create a plausible scenario to convince the victim to share sensitive information.
  - Urgency and Fear Tactics: Vishing calls often involve a sense of urgency, such as threats of legal

### Snake carving in Kasaragod



### Why in news?

- A snake carving has been discovered on a stone.
- The carving dates back to the **megalithic period**.
- The discovery was made in a village in Kasaragod.

### About Snake carving in Kasaragod:

- A significant feature of the site is a four-inch-thick stone carving of a snake circumventing an egg.
- The carvings were noticed by social activist and history enthusiast Satishan Kaliyanam.
- The carvings were identified as similar to the tiger carvings near Bangalam ground at Neeleswaram and at Cheemeni.
- The stone carving at Alinkeezhil could be approximately 2,000 years old.
- The snake shape was carved using an iron tool.


### Why in news?

- The E.K. Nayanar Museum at Burnassery in Kannur, part of the E.K. Nayanar Academy, was inaugurated on Sunday.
- The museum was opened on the 20th death anniversary of the late Chief Minister, E.K. Nayanar.

### **About E.K. Nayanar:**

- Erambala Krishnan Nayanar, commonly known as E.K. Nayanar, was a prominent Indian politician and a leader of the Communist Party of India (Marxist) or CPI(M).
- He was born on 9th December 1919 in Kalliasseri,
   Kannur, in the then Madras Presidency.
- He served as the 9th Chief Minister of Kerala for three terms: from 1980 to 1981, from 1987 to 1991, and again from 1996 to 2001.
- His total tenure as Chief Minister spans 10 years, 11 months, and 22 days, making him the longest-serving Chief Minister of Kerala.
- He was also a member of the Politburo of the CPI(M).
- Nayanar passed away on 19th May 2004.

## **Elephant population estimation**



## Why in news?

- A synchronised elephant population estimation will be held across south India for three days starting from May 23.
- The field assessment is a key part of the resolutions by the inter-State Coordination Committee, which includes Kerala, Tamil Nadu, and Karnataka.

### Key points:

- The aim of these resolutions is to address human-wildlife conflict through joint action and intelligence sharing.
- Andhra Pradesh will also participate in this collaborative exercise.

#### About Asian Elephant:

- Scientific Name: Elephas maximus
- Habitat: Forests and grasslands of Southeast Asia, including countries like India, Sri Lanka, Myanmar, Thailand, Laos, Cambodia, Vietnam, and Sumatra.
