Child Nutrition Report 2024	<ul> <li>Why in the news?</li> <li>The recently released Child Nutrition Report 2024 indicates that severe food poverty is being experienced by one in four children under the age of 5 globally.</li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Key points:</li> <li>The report was released by the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund.</li> <li>UNICEF defines child food poverty as the inability of children to access and consume a nutritious and diverse diet during the first five years of life.</li> <li>Prevalence: One in four children under age 5 (27%, or 181 million) globally experiences severe food poverty, making them vulnerable to life-threatening malnutrition.</li> <li>Geographical Distribution: Over two-thirds of these children live in South Asia and sub-Saharan Africa. Specifically, 20 countries account for 65% of the children in severe food poverty: Afghanistan, Bangladesh, China, Côte d'Ivoire, the Democratic Republic of the Congo, Egypt,</li> </ul>













	<ul> <li>Ethiopia, Ghana, India, Indonesia, Myanmar, Niger, Nigeria, Pakistan, the Philippines, Somalia, South Africa, Uganda, the United Republic of Tanzania, and Yemen.</li> <li>Economic Context: The report finds that severe food poverty affects children in both poor and non-poor households. Approximately half (97 million) of the children in severe food poverty live in middle- and upper-income households.</li> </ul>
Santiago Network for Loss and Damage	<ul> <li>Why in the news?</li> <li>This week, the 60th Session of the Subsidiary Bodies (SB60) to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) in Bonn, Germany, hosted the third Glasgow Dialogue on Loss and Damage.</li> <li>About Santiago Network for Loss and Damage: <ul> <li>The Santiago Network for Loss and Damage:</li> <li>The Santiago Network aims to catalyze technical assistance to developing countries for averting, minimizing, and addressing loss and damage associated with the adverse effects of climate change.</li> <li>Establishment: It was established at COP25 (Conference of the Parties) held in Madrid, Spain, in 2019.</li> <li>Operationalization: The network is operationalized under the Warsaw International Mechanism for Loss and Damage associated with Climate Change Impacts.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
