	 About West Nile fever: Cause: Caused by the West Nile virus (WNV), a member of the Flavivirus genus. Transmission: Primarily transmitted to humans through the bite of an infected mosquito, mainly the Culex species. Birds are the main hosts and reservoirs of the virus. Can also be transmitted through blood transfusions, organ transplants, and from mother to baby during pregnancy, delivery, or breastfeeding (rare cases). Symptoms: Most people (approximately 80%) are asymptomatic. Mild Symptoms: Fever, headache, body aches, joint pains, vomiting, diarrhea, or rash. Severe Symptoms:

	 High fever, neck stiffness, stupor, disorientation, coma, tremors, seizures, and paralysis. This can lead to severe neurological illnesses such as encephalitis or meningitis. Incubation Period: Typically 2 to 14 days, but can be longer in people with weakened immune systems.

Safety and security of citizens, particularly women, children, and the elderly. Health and education. Coverage: Initially, 100 cities were selected to be developed as Smart Cities in multiple phases.
