Member Countries: The member countries of BIMSTEC are Bangladesh, Bhutan, India, Myanmar, Nepal, Sri Lanka, and Thailand. Objective: The primary objective of BIMSTEC is to promote regional cooperation and create an enabling environment for rapid economic development through identification and implementation of specific projects in the areas of mutual interest. Sectors of Cooperation: BIMSTEC focuses on 14 sectors, incluring ade and investment, Iechnology, Energy, Transportation, Tourism, Fisheries, Agriculture, Public health, Poverty alleviation, Counter-terrorism and transnational crime, Environment and disaster management, People-to-people contact, Cultural cooperation, and Climate change. Secretariat: The BIMSTEC Secretariat is located in Dhaka, Bangladesh. It was established in 2014.
