Maharashtra to Revise RTE Admission Rules



Context:

 The Maharashtra government has announced plans to issue a revised circular regarding the Right to Education (RTE) Act admissions, following an interim decision by the Bombay High Court on May 6.

Key points:

- The new guidelines will restrict the 25% reservation quota to self-financed, police welfare (unaided), and municipal corporation-run schools.
- This decision comes after the High Court stayed a February notification exempting private unaided schools within a onekilometer radius of government or aided schools from the RTE quota.
- In response to the High Court's stay, self-financed and unaided schools highlighted ongoing issues with delayed reimbursements from the state, which have accumulated to over Rs 2,000 crore.
- This financial strain has been exacerbated by the government's previous failure to pay, leading to significant operational challenges for these institutions.

Infrastructure Development Initiatives in Mumbai Metropolitan Region.



Context:

- Maharashtra's government has enabled the Mumbai Metropolitan Region Development Authority (MMRDA) to raise significant loans for infrastructural development, aiming to transform Mumbai into a future-ready metropolitan.
- The authority plans to secure up to ₹60,000 crore for various projects including metro lines, road tunnels, and solid waste management.
- This initiative is part of a broader strategy to increase Mumbai's GDP from \$140 billion to \$300 billion by 2030.
- Additionally, the MMRDA's budget for 2024-25 is set at ₹39,453.04 crore, with planned expenditures of ₹46,921.29 crore, focusing on enhancing public infrastructure across the Mumbai metropolitan region.
- These developments are expected to alleviate pressure on the real estate market and foster growth in both residential and commercial sectors

Maharashtra Election Update: Voter



Context:

- In the latest Maharashtra elections, Baramati reported the lowest voter turnout at 56.07%, despite hosting a notable contest between Supriya Sule of the NCP (SP) and Sunetra Pawar of the Ajit Pawar-led NCP.
- In contrast, Kolhapur saw the highest turnout at 68.03%, with Shahu Maharaj Chhatrapati of Congress competing against Sanjay Mandalik of Shiv Sena.
- The third phase of polling was marked by scattered incidents of violence and alleged electoral malpractices across multiple constituencies including Hatkanangle, Osmanabad, Raigad, and Baramati.
- Significant incidents included a fatal altercation in Osmanabad and an attempt to damage an EVM in Solapur.
- These elections involved 258 candidates across eleven constituencies in the regions of western Maharashtra, Marathwada, and Konkan.
- The results of these polls will notably impact the political landscape of the state, following closely watched contests in several key areas.
