National	Digital	Livestock	Why in news?
Mission			 The new directive from the animal husbandry department in Maharashtra, urging cattle owners to ear tag their livestock. The directive is aimed at regulating the movement and management of cattle.
			 Ear tagging is mandatory across Maharashtra to prevent illegal slaughter and cruelty towards animals. The ear tagging system has been initiated as part of the National Digital Livestock Mission of the central government. Ear tagging involves putting on display a 12-digit barcode for the cattle. The barcode records their birth, vaccination schedule, medical treatment history and ownership details.
			About National Digital Livestock Mission:
			 It is a significant initiative in India aimed at creating a farmer-centric, technology-enabled ecosystem for livestock. The NDLM is a digital platform being developed jointly by the Department of Animal Husbandry and Dairying (DAHD) and the National Dairy Development Board (NDDB) on the foundation of the existing Information Network for Animal Productivity and Health (INAPH). The aim of the NDLM is to enable farmers to realize better

income through livestock activities.





Panchaganga river	Why in news?
	 The Maharashtra Pollution Control Board (MPCB) and Kolhapur Municipal Corporation (KMC) officials conducted a joint survey of the Panchaganga river to identify sources of pollution. The survey was carried out to find the sources causing river pollution.
	About Panchaganga river:
	 Location: The Panchaganga River flows through the Indian state of Maharashtra.
	 Source: It originates in the Western Ghats, near the Prayag Sangam, at a place called Prayag.
	 Confluence: The Panchaganga is formed by the confluence of five rivers – the Kasari, the Kumbhi, the Tulsi, the Bhogawati, and the Saraswati. Major Cities: The river flows through major cities like Kolhapur. Cultural Importance: The riverbanks host several important temples and pilgrimage sites, including the famous Mahalaxmi Temple in Kolhapur.
Nag River	Why in news?
	 MahaMetro has initiated desilting of the Nag River stretch inside Krazy Castle premises but is awaiting funds from the State Disaster Relief Fund (SDRF) for riverbed widening. The widening of the riverbed is crucial to prevent flooding, especially during the monsoon season.
	About Nag River:
	 Location: The Nag River is located in Nagpur, Maharashtra. Origin: Forming a part of the Kanhan-Pench river system, the Nag River originates in Lava hills near Wadi. Significance: The city of Nagpur, which is named after the Nag River, derives its name from this river. Tributaries: Bor Nallah, Pili river, Futala, Pora river, and 24 natural drains within the city are its tributaries.

Saksharta Karyakram	 Maharashtra is lagging behind in terms of achieving its desired target of literacy as only over 4 lakh people have qualified as 'literate' in the exam held under the New India Literacy Program (NILP).

	 The NILP, also known as "ULLAS – Nav Bharat Saksharta Karyakram", is a centrally sponsored scheme on Education for All. The initiative launched by the Indian government to promote lifelong learning and bridge the gaps in basic literacy and critical life skills among citizens aged 15 and above. The scheme is being implemented in alignment with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020. The scheme has five components: Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, Critical Life Skills, Basic Education, Vocational Skills,
Maharashtra Real Estate	Continuing Education.Why in news?
Agency (MahaRERA)	 The Maharashtra Real Estate Agency (MahaRERA) is taking steps to ensure homebuyers receive better quality homes. They have proposed a draft regulation to improve the quality of real estate projects.
	 Wey points: Under this regulation, developers will be required to provide a self-certification declaration for quality assurance of their projects. Developers will also need to provide detailed information on the technical aspects of their projects.





About MahaRERA:

- Establishment: MahaRERA was established under the Real Estate (Regulation and Development) Act, 2016.
- Purpose: To regulate and promote the real estate sector in Maharashtra, ensuring transparency, accountability, and efficiency.
- Registration: All commercial and residential real estate projects and agents in Maharashtra must register with MahaRERA before advertising or selling.
- Objectives:
 - Protect the interests of homebuyers.
 - Ensure timely completion and delivery of projects.
 - Increase transparency in project execution and real estate transactions.
 - Address grievances of buyers and other stakeholders.

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
