These villages are currently located in the core area of the Sahyadri Tiger Reserve. About Sahyadri Tiger Reserve: The Sahyadri Tiger Reserve is a significant wildlife reserve located in the state of Maharashtra. It was established by the Indian government in 2008. The reserve is situated in the Sahyadri Ranges of the Western Ghats of Maharashtra. It is part of the ecoregions of North Western Ghats moist deciduous forests and North Western Ghats montane rain forests. The reserve spreads over Koyna Wildlife Sanctuary, Chandoli National Park, and Radhanagari Wildlife Sanctuary

The commission is responsible for examining and recommending requests for inclusion or exclusion in the lists of other backward classes of citizens. It also advises the State Government on complaints of

over-inclusion or under-inclusion in such lists.

Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA)	Why in the news? ■ The Bombay High Court made observations on the Maharashtra government's slum policy.
	 Key points: This policy allows for the conversion of private and public lands into free tenements for encroachers, once it is recognised as a slum rehabilitation area. The court also commented that if the Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA) and the official machinery had acted according to the law, Mumbai would not be known for its slums on private and public land.
	 About Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA): Establishment: The Slum Rehabilitation Authority (SRA) was established to implement slum rehabilitation schemes and improve the living conditions of slum dwellers. Objective: The main objective of the SRA is to provide housing to slum dwellers by redeveloping slum areas and rehabilitating slum dwellers into newly constructed residential complexes. Dengue	 Why in the news? Maharashtra reports 1755 dengue cases till May, state increases surveillance ahead of monsoon.
	 Definition: Dengue is a mosquito-borne viral infection causing a severe flu-like illness and, sometimes, a potentially lethal complication called severe dengue or dengue hemorrhagic fever. Causing Agent: Dengue is caused by the dengue virus (DENV), which has four distinct serotypes (DENV-1, DENV-2, DENV-3, and DENV-4). Transmission: The virus is transmitted to humans through the bites of infected female mosquitoes, primarily the Aedes aegypti and, to a lesser extent, Aedes albopictus.
