Chenab Bridge	Why in the news?
	• Railways conducts trial run on world's highest arch rail bridge in J&K.
	About Chenab Bridge:
	 Location: The Chenab Bridge is situated in the Reasi district of Jammu and Kashmir, India.
	• River Spanned : It spans the Chenab River .
	• Significance: It is the world's highest railway bridge, standing at a height of 359 meters (1,178 feet) above the river bed.
	 Design: The bridge follows an arch design, which provides strength and stability, especially important for its high-altitude location.
	• Purpose: The Chenab Bridge is part of the Udhampur-Srinagar- Baramulla Rail Link project, aimed at improving connectivity to the Kashmir Valley.

	• World Refugee Day is annually celebrated globally on June 20th.
	About World Refugee Day:
	 Dedication: To the millions forced to escape their homes due to war, persecution, or natural catastrophes.
	Theme 2024: For a World Where Refugees Are Welcomed
	History:
	• First Celebration: June 20, 2001
	 Commemoration: 50th anniversary of the 1951 Convention relating to the Status of Refugees
	 Earlier Recognition: Known as Africa Refugee Day
	• Official Declaration: In December 2000, the United Nations
	General Assembly (UNGA) declared it an International Day for Refugees.

	• A remarkable ancient site on the tiny Greek island of Delos is "doomed to disappear" within decades due to rising sea levels and geological processes.
	 About Delos Island: Location: Delos is a small island situated in the Aegean Sea, part of the Cyclades archipelago in Greece. Historical Significance: It is considered the birthplace of Apollo and Artemis, according to Greek mythology. UNESCO World Heritage Site: The island was inscribed on the UNESCO World Heritage List in 1990 due to its extensive
	archaeological remains and its significance in ancient Greek history.

	Publisher: The Sustainable Development Solutions Network (SDSN) and Bertelsmann Stiftung.
	 Purpose: To assess and rank the progress of countries towards achieving the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
	Coverage: Includes data from 193 UN member states.
	 Key Indicators: The report evaluates progress on 17 SDGs using indicators such as poverty reduction, education, health, and environmental sustainability.
	Top Performers: Finland, Sweden, and Denmark
	 The Sustainable Development Report (SDR) introduces new FABLE (Food, Agriculture, Biodiversity, Land, and Energy) pathways to promote sustainable food and land systems.
