• The Forest Department in Gujarat has begun translocating spotted deer and sambars from Gir Forest to Barda Wildlife Sanctuary to enhance the long-term conservation of Asiatic lions.

- Dams: Khambala Dam, Fodara Dam

- Gir-Barda Project: Initiated in 1979
- Aim: Develop Barda as the second home for the Asiatic lion
- Flora:

#### Why in the news?

• The Fast Track Immigration Trusted Traveller Programme (FTI-TTP) was inaugurated by the Union Home Minister at Indira Gandhi International (IGI) Airport.

#### **About FTI-TTP**:

- Initiative Central Government
- Designed for faster, smoother, and safer immigration clearance.
- Objective: Reduce congestion at airports by offering expedited emigration and immigration clearance for pre-verified travelers.
- Collaborating Ministries:
  - Ministry of Home Affairs
  - Ministry of Civil Aviation
  - o Bureau of Immigration
- Comparison: Similar to the Global Entry Program of the United States.
- Mechanism:
  - Operates on e-gates or automated border gates to minimize human intervention.
  - Phase 1: Covers Indian citizens and OCI cardholders.
  - Phase 2: Includes foreign travelers.
- Enrollment Process:
  - Through an online portal managed by the Bureau of Immigration.

State of Global Air (SoGA) report	<ul> <li>Why in the news?</li> <li>Air pollution is increasingly impacting human health and is now the second leading global risk factor for death, according to the fifth edition of the State of Global Air (SoGA) report.</li> <li>About State of Global Air (SoGA) report:         <ul> <li>Released by: Health Effects Institute (HEI) in partnership with UNICEF.</li> <li>Scope: Provides an analysis of air quality and health impacts globally.</li> <li>Air Pollution Definition:</li></ul></li></ul>





- Key Findings:
  - Global Risk Factor:
    - Air pollution is the second-leading global risk factor for death.
    - Surpasses tobacco and diabetes; only hypertension is higher.
  - Oisease Burden:
    - Non-communicable diseases account for nearly 90% of the disease burden from air pollution.
    - Includes heart disease, stroke, diabetes, lung cancer, and chronic obstructive pulmonary disease (COPD).
- Deaths Attributed to Air Pollution:
  - Total Deaths (2021):
    - 8.1 million global deaths.
    - India accounts for 25% of these deaths.
  - Major Pollutants:
    - **PM2.5 particles**: Cause 60% of deaths due to air pollution.
    - Ozone and household air pollution: Account for 38% and 6% of deaths, respectively.
- Regional Impact:
  - India and China together account for 54% of the global disease burden due to air pollution.
  - o India: 21 lakh (2.1 million) deaths.
  - o China: 23 lakh (2.3 million) deaths.
