Atal Setu



Why in the news?

 The Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sewri-Nhava Sheva Atal Setu, popularly known as the Mumbai Trans Harbour Link (MTHL), has recently come under scrutiny due to cracks appearing on its tar road exit toward Ulwe in Navi Mumbai.

About Atal Setu:

- Name: Atal Bihari Vajpayee Sewri-Nhava Sheva Atal Setu
- **Type**: Cable-stayed bridge
- Location: Connects Sewri in Mumbai to Nhava Sheva (Jawaharlal Nehru Port) in Navi Mumbai, Maharashtra
- Purpose: To provide an alternate route for cargo and vehicular traffic, reducing congestion in Mumbai and enhancing connectivity to the Jawaharlal Nehru Port
- Construction Start Date: 2018
- Key Features:
 - o Will be the longest sea bridge in India
 - Designed to withstand high winds and seismic activity
 - Includes dedicated lanes for emergency services
- Significance:
 - Named in honor of former Prime Minister Atal Bihari
 Vajpayee
 - Expected to significantly reduce travel time between Mumbai and Navi Mumbai
 - Will enhance the efficiency of cargo movement to and from the Jawaharlal Nehru Port, the largest container port in India
- **Developing Authority**: Maharashtra State Road Development Corporation (MSRDC)

Why in the news?

• The Thane Municipal Corporation (TMC) has taken a significant step toward flood resilience by releasing the Thane City Action Plan for Flood Risk Management 2024.


Key points:

- Developed in collaboration with the Maharashtra government and the Council on Energy, Environment, and Water (CEEW), this pioneering plan aims to enhance the city's preparedness and response to urban floods.
- **Urban Flood Risk Assessment**: The report computed an administrative ward-wise urban flood risk index.
- Flood Hotspots and Recommendations:
 - Using water-logged area mapping and the flood risk index, hotspot areas within very high and high-risk wards were identified.
 - The plan provides actionable short, medium, and longterm recommendations for both monsoon and nonmonsoon phases.





Kavach system



Why in the news?

 The Central Railway is taking a significant step toward enhancing railway safety by deploying the Kavach system along the Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Terminus-Howrah route.

About Kavach system:

- Purpose: The Kavach system is designed to enhance the safety and efficiency of railway operations in India.
- Implementation: Developed and implemented by the Indian Railways, it aims to prevent train collisions and improve train control.
- Functionality:
 - Automatic Train Protection (ATP): Kavach provides automatic train protection by controlling the speed of trains and preventing collisions.
 - **Signal Passing at Danger (SPAD)**: The system prevents trains from passing signals that indicate danger.
 - **Automatic Braking**: If a train passes a red signal, the system automatically applies the brakes to stop the train.
- Technology: Utilizes GPS-based technology and radio communication between trains and control centers.





Khanderi Fort	Why in the news?
	 The Khanderi Fort in Alibaug, Maharashtra, has recently been declared a state-protected monument by the Maharashtra government. With this protection status, the archaeological department will now be responsible for its maintenance, and there are plans to nominate it for UNESCO World Heritage status.
	About Khanderi Fort:

- - **Location**: Khanderi Fort, also known as **Kanhoji Angre Island**, is located on a small island south of Mumbai, Maharashtra.
 - Historical Significance:
 - o Built in 1679 by the Maratha ruler Shivaji Maharaj to control maritime activities in the Arabian Sea.
 - Named after Kanhoji Angre, the chief of the Maratha **navy**, who played a significant role in defending the fort.
 - **Strategic Importance**:
 - o Part of the twin forts of Khanderi and Underi, which were crucial in controlling naval trade routes.
 - o The fort served as a significant naval base for the Marathas.
 - Ownership:
 - Initially under Maratha control, later captured by the **British in 1750** after a prolonged siege.

Key points:
