	<ul> <li>About Living Will:</li> <li>Definition: A living will is a legal document that outlines a person's preferences for medical treatment in situations where they are unable to communicate their decisions.</li> <li>Purpose: It allows individuals to specify their wishes regarding life-sustaining treatments, resuscitation, and other medical procedures.</li> <li>Supreme Court Ruling (2018): <ul> <li>Case: Common Cause vs. Union of India.</li> <li>Recognition: Terminally ill patients or those in a persistent vegetative state can execute an "advance medical directive" or a "living will" to refuse medical treatment.</li> <li>Sanction: The ruling gave legal sanction to passive euthanasia and living wills/advance directives.</li> </ul> </li> <li>The court laid down specific principles relating to the procedure for executing a living will.</li> </ul>
