About CIBIL score:
<ul> <li>CIBIL (Credit Information Bureau India Limited) score is a numeric representation of an individual's creditworthiness.</li> <li>It ranges from 300 to 900, with higher scores indicating better creditworthiness.</li> </ul>
• Factors Influencing CIBIL Score:
<ul> <li>Payment History: Timely repayment of loans and credit card bills.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Credit Utilization Ratio: The percentage of available credit limit used.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Credit Mix: Types of credit accounts (secured, unsecured).</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>Length of Credit History: Duration of credit accounts and loans.</li> </ul>
<ul> <li>New Credit: Recent inquiries and new credit accounts opened.</li> </ul>

	About Sant Dnyaneshwar Maharaj padayatra wari:		
	<ul> <li>Origin and Significance: The padayatra wari is a pilgrimage that follows the footsteps of Sant Dnyaneshwar Maharaj, a revered 13th-century saint-poet and philosopher in Maharashtra.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Duration: The padayatra typically spans about 21 days, covering a distance of approximately 250-300 kilometers.</li> </ul>		
	<ul> <li>Route: It traditionally starts from Alandi, near Pune, where Sant Dnyaneshwar attained Samadhi, and proceeds to Pandharpur, ending at the Vithoba temple.</li> </ul>

#### **About Sant Dnyaneshwar:**

- Birth and Early Life:
  - Born as Dnyaneshwar in 1275 AD in Apegaon, near Paithan, Maharashtra.
  - He was the second son of **Vithalpant** and **Rukmini**.
  - His family faced societal ostracization due to his father's renouncement of Brahminical rituals.
- Philosophical Contributions:
  - Dnyaneshwar was a prominent Marathi saint, poet, and philosopher of the Bhakti movement.
  - Known for his devotional and spiritual works, which emphasized the path of devotion (Bhakti) over ritualistic practices.
- Literary Works:
  - Authored the Dnyaneshwari (Bhavarth Deepika), a Marathi commentary on the Bhagavad Gita, written around 1290 AD.
  - Composed the **Amrutanubhav**, a philosophical treatise in Marathi.

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
