### Why in the news?

- Shahu Maharaj's 150th birth anniversary was celebrated in Kolhapur city.
- Guardian minister Hasan Mushrif has advocated for awarding the Bharat Ratna to Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj in recognition of his philanthropic contributions.

### About Rajarshi Chhatrapati Shahu Maharaj:

- Full Name: Shahuji Maharaj of Kolhapur
- Birth: June 26, 1874Death: May 6, 1922
- **Title**: Rajarshi (meaning Royal Sage)
- Reign: Ruled the princely state of Kolhapur from 1894 to 1922.
- Known for his progressive policies and social reforms.
- Social Reforms:
  - Championed the cause of the underprivileged and backward classes.
  - Implemented reservation policies in education and government jobs for backward classes.
  - Established hostels for students from marginalized communities.
  - Promoted education for girls and opened several schools for them.

#### Economic Reforms:

- Advocated for agricultural reforms and the welfare of farmers.
- Encouraged cooperative farming and the establishment of cooperative societies.
- Introduced measures to improve the economic status of the rural population.

	<ul> <li>About Zika virus:</li> <li>Zika virus is a mosquito-borne flavivirus.</li> <li>First identified in monkeys in Uganda in 1947 and in humans in 1952.</li> <li>Transmitted primarily by Aedes mosquitoes, particularly Aedes aegypti.</li> <li>Transmission: <ul> <li>Mosquito bites.</li> <li>From mother to fetus during pregnancy, leading to congenital Zika syndrome.</li> <li>Sexual transmission.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
	<ul> <li>Blood transfusion (rare cases).</li> </ul>

## Article 371 (2) of the Constitution of India

### Why in the news?

 The Nagpur bench of the Bombay High Court strongly criticized the Government of India (GoI) for its failure to reconstitute the statutory development boards in Maharashtra.

### **About Article 371 (2) of the Constitution of India:**

- **Special Provisions**: Article 371 (2) provides special provisions for the states of **Maharashtra** and **Gujarat**.
- Governor's Special Responsibilities:
  - Establishment of Development Boards: The Governor has the special responsibility to establish separate development boards for Vidarbha, Marathwada, and the rest of Maharashtra; and Saurashtra, Kutch, and the rest of Gujarat.
  - **Equitable Allocation of Funds**: Ensuring equitable allocation of funds for development across the regions.
  - Equitable Arrangements for Technical Education:
     Ensuring equitable arrangements for providing adequate facilities for technical education and vocational training.
- Legislative Safeguard: The provisions under Article 371 (2) aim to address the regional disparities within the states and ensure balanced development.
- Historical Context: Article 371 (2) was inserted by the Constitution (Seventh Amendment) Act, 1956, and later amended by the Constitution (Forty-second Amendment) Act, 1976.
- Scope and Impact: It is designed to provide a framework for addressing developmental imbalances within the states of Maharashtra and Gujarat, focusing on backward regions to promote social and economic equality.





### Mhadei river

### Why in the news?

 State water resources minister of Goa announced that the Mahadayi Prawah (Mhadei Water Management Authority) will conduct site inspections along the Mhadei river in Goa, Karnataka, and Maharashtra from July 4 to 8.

#### About Mhadei river:

- Location: The Mhadei River, also known as the Mandovi River.
- It flows through the states of **Karnataka**, **Maharashtra**, and **Goa**.
- Source: The river originates in the Western Ghats, from the Bhimgad Wildlife Sanctuary in the Belagavi district of Karnataka.
- The river flows through the dense forests of the Western Ghats in Karnataka.
- It then **enters Goa**, where it is known as the Mandovi River and ultimately **merges with the Arabian Sea near Panaji**.
- **Tributaries**: Key tributaries include the Surla, Ragada, and Kotra rivers.
