Formation: Formed by the confluence of five rivers - Kasari, Kumbhi, Tulsi, Bhogawati, and Saraswati at Prayag Sangam. Confluence: Merges with the Krishna River at Kurundvad, Maharashtra. Valley: The valley of the Panchganga River is very fertile and yields rich crops during the winter season. Pollution: Pollution levels have been increasing rapidly over the last decade due to the disposal of untreated municipal sewage from Kolhapur town.
Best Agriculture State Award	 Why in the news? Maharashtra has been honored with the Best Agriculture State Award for 2024 by the 15th Agriculture Leadership Awards Committee. Key points: The announcement was made by the committee, chaired by former Chief Justice of India, Justice P. Sathasivam. The committee recognized Maharashtra's sustainable development policies focusing on environmental protection and food security. Initiatives such as bamboo cultivation, the Shri Anna Abhiyan for cereals, and biomass utilization in thermal power generation contributed to this prestigious recognition.
Renaming of seven stations on the Mumbai local train network	 Why in the news? The Maharashtra legislative council has unanimously passed a resolution to rename seven stations on the Mumbai local train network. The aim is to tackle the colonial legacy associated with some station names.

• Charni Road will take on the name Girgaon.
Cotton Green station will be Kalachowki.
 Dockyard Road will change to Mazgaon.
• King's Circle will be known as Tirthankar Parswanath.
 This move reflects a trend toward culturally resonant names for public spaces in Mumbai.
 Notably, iconic stations like Victoria Terminus (VT) were
previously renamed to Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj
Terminus (CSMT), and Elphinstone Road became Prabhadevi.
