Meghalaya PSC Prelims Exam Syllabus

The syllabus for the Meghalaya PSC Prelims Exam includes two objective-type papers, namely Paper I and Paper II.

Paper-I: General Studies

- Current events of national and international importance
- History of India and the Indian National Movement
- Indian and World Geography Physical, Social, and Economic Geography of India and the World
- Indian Polity and Governance Constitution, Political System, Panchayati Raj, Public Policy, Rights Issues, etc.
- Economic and Social Development Sustainable Development, Poverty, Inclusion, Demographics, Social Sector Initiatives, etc.
- General Issues on Environmental Ecology, Biodiversity, and Climate Change
- General Science

Paper-II: English, Aptitude & Mental Ability

- Comprehension
- Interpersonal skills including communication skills
- Logical reasoning and analytical ability
- Decision-making and problem-solving
- General mental ability
- Basic numeracy (numbers and their relations, orders of magnitude, etc.) (Class X level)
- Data interpretation (charts, graphs, tables, data sufficiency, etc. Class X level)

Meghalaya PSC Mains Exam Syllabus

The Meghalaya Public Service Commission (MPSC) conducts the Meghalaya Mains Exam, which is the second stage of the recruitment process for various posts in the state government. The Meghalaya Mains Exam consists of eight papers in total, including four compulsory papers and four optional papers.

English	Essay writing, Comprehension, Precise writing, Sentence completion, Grammar, and vocabulary
English Essay	In writing essays on multiple topics, the effective and exact expression
General Studies-I	Modern history, pre-independence era, and post-independence era, History of the world, Women empowerment and social empowerment of women, Geography with special focus on physical geography, including concepts like earthquakes, volcanoes, and the layers of the earth's crust.
General Studies-II	Federal Indian government, Parliament and state legislations, Civil acts and public legislature, India and international relations, Representation of people's actions, Welfare schemes developed by the government

Paper	Important Topics
Studios III	Indian economy and budgeting, Major crops in India, Public administration system, Infrastructure, Science and technology in India, IT in India, Disaster management in India
General Studies-IV	Ethics in modern society, Public administration functioning and value system, Civil integrity rules and regulations, Governance – issues and citizen charter, Case studies

Meghalaya PSC Prelims Exam Pattern

The Meghalaya PSC Prelims Exam consists of two papers - Paper I and Paper II. Both papers are objective type and carry 200 marks each. The duration of each paper is two hours.

Paper I covers General Studies and consists of questions on current events, the history of India and the Indian National Movement, Indian and World Geography, Indian Polity and Governance, Economic and Social Development, General issues on Environmental Ecology, Biodiversity and Climate Change, and General Science.

Meghalaya PSC Mains Exam Pattern

The Meghalaya PSC Mains Exam is a written examination and consists of six papers. The papers are conducted over a period of three days.

- The Meghalaya PSC Mains Exam consists of seven papers, including one English paper worth 300 marks, which is just a practice test. The marks obtained in this paper will not be counted for ranking.
- The marks obtained by the candidates in Papers II to VII only will be counted for merit ranking.
- The mains exam carries 1750 marks in total, with each paper carrying a maximum of 250 marks.
- Each paper will be of three hours in duration.
- There will be no negative marking in the MPSC Meghalaya Mains exam.
