1,200-year-old Buddha statue finds place in govt office in Kolkata



A 1,200-year-old Buddha statue found in Bengal's Purulia district earlier this year will be temporarily kept in the storeroom of a state government office in Kolkata.



Key points

- The statue of the Buddha head with half-closed lips and open eyes is approximately 1,200 years old
- Belongs to the transition period of Gupta-Pal dynasty
- The head of the statue was found buried at Manbazar area in Purulia district.

Did you know?

Gopala, who was founder of Pala dynasty after the end of Gupta period, is said to have followed Buddhism.

Prized Bangladeshi Hilsas to hit Indian markets before Durga Puja

Context

The Bangladesh government has permitted traders to sell nearly 4,000 metric tonnes of Hilsa to India ahead of the festive Durga Puja season

Key points

- Hilsa Fish is found in rivers and estuaries of Indian subcontinent and the Tigris and Euphrates river of the Persian Gulf area
- It is the national fish of Bangladesh
- It is highly valued in India especially in West Bengal, Odisha, Andhra Pradesh and Tamil Nadu.
- IUCN status: Least concern.

Cyclone Tej to hit Bengal before Durga Puja	Context Cyclone "Tej" may hit Bengal in October before Durga Puja bringing heavy rainfall.
	 Key points India has named the Cyclone "Tej". The responsibility of naming tropical cyclones that form over the Bay of Bengal and Arabian Sea falls on the RSMC New Delhi Tropical Cyclone Center.
	 About cyclone: A cyclone is any low-pressure area with winds spiraling inwards. Cyclones rotate anti clockwise in the northern hemisphere and clockwise in the southern hemisphere. The process of cyclone formation is known as cyclogenesis.
	Did you know? Cyclones cannot survive without moisture hence they get weaken over land and fall

Bay of Bengal and cyclone

Reason:

- 1. The Bay of Bengal is relatively shallow than the Arabian sea
- 2. The larger surface area of the Bay of Bengal allows faster heating causing higher evaporation
- 3. Faster evaporation forms a high-pressure zone in the area causing instability in the region.
- 4. land on three sides generates additional moisture and instability
- 5. The **long and curved coastline** of the Bay of Bengal results in amplified wind speeds as they funnel into the bay
- 6. The Bay of Bengal has a much larger area than other water bodies in the region. This makes it easy for a storm to dissipate

Did you know?

Bay of Bengal known as the hot bed of cyclones.
