No family size limit, including coverage for pre-existing ailments. Eligibility: West Bengal residency, not enrolled in other government health insurance. The scheme ensures accessible healthcare for residents, addressing financial barriers.

East Kolkata Wetlands (EKW)	 It is located on the eastern periphery of the city of Kolkata and extends up to the Bidyadhari-Matla River confluence. It is a Ramsar Site and acts as an absorber basin for a large number of contaminants drained from Kolkata. Agricultural lands, sewage-fed fisheries, garbage dumping fields, horticulture, and built-up areas are included in this protected area, which covers approximately 125 km2.
National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB) report for 2022	 Kolkata is the safest city in India for the third consecutive year, with the lowest cognizable offences per lakh people among cities with over 20 lakh population. The city's crime rate has steadily declined since 2016, reaching 86.5 offences per 1 lakh population in 2022, a significant improvement from 159.6 in 2016. The decline is attributed to investments in technology, infrastructure, manpower, and effective policing practices, according to senior police officers.
