New Republic Day Pact Allows States One Tableau Every Three Years

In recent years, the selection of tableaux for the Republic Day parade has been marred by controversies, with complaints from various States about the exclusion of their representations. The Defence Ministry has responded to these concerns by proposing a comprehensive rollover plan to address the issue. Official sources reveal that the Defence Ministry has proposed a rollover plan to give every State and Union Territory (UT) an opportunity to showcase their tableaux within a three-year cycle. Approximately 15 tableaux are selected for the Republic Day parade each year, making it challenging to accommodate every State annually. The proposed plan aims at ensuring equitable distribution and fair representation for all.

EAM S. Jaishankar Boosts India-Nepal Relations in Two-Day Visit

The leaders announced the elevation of bilateral ties to a Comprehensive Strategic Cooperative Partnership, demonstrating the mutual commitment to enhancing diplomatic relations between the two nations. Twenty key agreements were signed, encompassing various sectors such as tourism cooperation, disaster risk reduction, blue economy, and investments in the digital economy. The agreements also included a commitment from China to provide grant assistance to the Maldives, with specific details undisclosed.

Security Agreement Signed Between Ukraine And Britain In Kyiv

Kerala Woman Sets Guinness Record, Sings In 100+ Languages

Singing in an astounding 140 languages, she captivated the audience and earned widespread acclaim for her musical prowess. The selection of 140 symbolizes the nations participating in the COP 28 summit held in Dubai. Suchetha Satish, a 16-year-old prodigy, mesmerized the audience at the Indian Consulate Auditorium in Dubai during the Concert for Climate. The event was part of the COP 28 summit, attended by representatives from over 140 nations, emphasizing the global significance of her achievement.

Ancient Tools Found In Telangana's Mulugu District

The Mulugu district of Telangana has become the stage for an unexpected archaeological revelation following the devastating floods in July 2023. Amidst the aftermath of the natural disaster, a team of amateur historians stumbled upon a collection of paleolithic quartzite tools that have not only captivated the local community but also pushed back the understanding of human habitations in Telangana and central India. Sriramoju Haragopal, the leader of the enthusiastic team, explained that the discovery occurred in the sand bed of a stream that had dried up after the flood. The exposed tools, identified as hand axes, were found between Gurrevula and Bhupatipuram villages in Mulugu district. The significant find was a stone axe measuring 15.5cm in length, 11cm in width, and 5.5cm in thickness. Eleswaram Janardanachari, a dedicated researcher, was the one who made this remarkable discovery.

Naveen Patnaik Inaugurates Malkangiri Airport In Odisha

On January 9, Odisha's Chief Minister, Naveen Patnaik, achieved a significant milestone with the inauguration of the Malkangiri airport in the southwestern region of the state. Chennai Tops As Best City For Indian Women

Chennai emerged as the top Indian city for women in 2023 in terms of inclusivity and conduciveness to working women, as per findings from diversity, equity, and inclusivity consultant Avtar Group's Top Cities for Women in India (TCWI) 2023. Tamil Nadu cities topped both categories that the study covered – 49 cities in the million-plus population category and 64 cities in the less than a million-population category. Chennai topped the million-plus category, and Tiruchirappalli came on top of the less than a million category. The southern state also had a total of seven cities featuring in the lists.

EU Scientists Confirm 2023 As Hottest Year Ever Recorded

On January 9, the European Union's Copernicus Climate Change Service (C3S) declared that the year gone by was the hottest on record, significantly surpassing previous temperatures and potentially marking the warmest period in the last 100,000 years. The announcement sheds light on the alarming trajectory of global warming, with each passing month breaking climate records and raising concerns about the consequences for the planet. Scientists had anticipated this milestone, considering the consistent shattering of climate records. From June onward, each month in 2023 has claimed the title of the hottest on record compared to its respective month in preceding years. C3S Director Carlo Buontempo described the year as "very exceptional" and noted its uniqueness even when compared to other notably warm years.

Six Nations Top Global Passport Ranking, With Access To 194 Destinations

In a significant development, France, Germany, Italy, Japan, Singapore, and Spain share the top spot in the quarterly ranking of the world's most powerful passports. Enjoying visa-free or visa-on-arrival access to an impressive 194 destinations, this marks a historic high since the inception of the Henley Passport Index 19 years ago. Japan and Singapore, holding the top position for the past five years, now see a triumphant rise for Europe. Finland and Sweden, tied with South Korea, secure the second spot with easy access to 193 destinations. Following closely, Austria, Denmark, Ireland, and the Netherlands claim the third position, providing access to 192 destinations.
