| Malda: 'Processing unit to make manure from daily household waste from next year' | Context: The English Bazar Municipality (EBM) in Malda, is setting up a processing unit to convert daily household waste into manure and fuel. The unit will be located at Kanchanter initially, with a permanent location planned later. The civic body is also setting up 2 dumping grounds for the waste disposal at Bahadurpur and Kanchanter areas At Bahadurpur, a land of 3.295 acres and at Kanchanter, 6.28 acres of land has been specified for the project. The project is expected to be operational by the next financial year. About: The processing will produce two main outputs: Manure: This organic fertilizer can be used in agriculture, reducing dependence on chemical fertilizers. Refuse Derived Fuel (RDF): This fuel can be burned to generate electricity, offering a renewable energy source. |
