Impact of Climate Change on Disease Profiles: Sunderbans	 Context: Climate change is impacting disease profiles in regions from Sunderbans to Khyber Pakhtunkhwa. The Sunderbans, known for its Royal Bengal Tiger population, is also home to over 4 million people engaged in the climate change battle.
	 Key points: In the Sunderbans, changes in cropping patterns have worsened malnutrition. Climate change impacts include rising incidence of waterborne diseases, skin infections, menstrual irregularities, and miscarriages. However, there is a lack of credible data quantifying these problems. Medical literature in the Sunderbans highlights suicides, largely due to ecological factors like climatic insults, natural calamities, poverty, and domestic violence. The public health system is inadequate, and non-governmental organizations fill the gap with village health camps.
Governor and State Clash: Education Minister's Removal Sought	Context: In a recent development, Governor C V Ananda Bose has sought the removal of Education Minister Bratya Basu from the Cabinet, accusing him of violating the Model Code of Conduct (MCC). The Bengal government responded by sending a detailed 9-page letter to the Governor, reminding him of his constitutional limitations. Key points: Article 164: Under Article 164 of the Constitution, the Chief Minister is appointed by the Governor without any advice from anyone.

	 Constitutional Limitations on Governor's Discretion: The Chief Minister holds the authority to select or remove a Minister, acting as the voice of the people. During the Constituent Assembly discussions, B.R. Ambedkar clarified that the Governor lacks autonomous executive powers according to the Constitution. Article 164 of the Constitution includes the Governor's "pleasure," which solely pertains to the formal action of issuing dismissal orders based on the Chief Minister's advice.
428 polling booths to be managed by women in phase I:CEO	 In the first phase of Lok Sabha elections in Cooch Behar, Alipurduar, and Jalpaiguri on April 19, women will manage at least 428 polling booths. The Chief Electoral Officer (CEO) stated that there will be approximately 230 booths managed by women in Alipurduar, 138 in Jalpaiguri, and 60 in Cooch Behar.
	 Key points: On average, one booth in every Assembly constituency in Bengal will be manned by women election personnel, making up about 10% of the total seats. The Election Commission of India (ECI) introduced 'home voting' for the first time this year, benefiting voters above 85, over 40% handicapped individuals, and those belonging to 18 emergency services.
Samta Diwas	 Key Points: Samta Diwas (Harmony Day) is observed on April 5th to honor the birth anniversary of Babu Jagjivan Ram, a prominent Indian politician. The day emphasizes promoting equality in all aspects of society. Ram's legacy includes championing the cause of social justice, particularly for disadvantaged groups. About: Babu Jagjivan Ram (1908-1986) was a prominent Indian independence activist, politician, and champion of social justice. Played a key role in the fight for independence, inspired by Mahatma Gandhi. Held various ministerial positions for over 30 years with the Indian National Congress (INC). Notably served as Defence Minister during the 1971 Indo-Pakistan War, contributing to the creation of
