Bengal Government to Establish Two GST Tribunal Benches	Context:  • The Bengal government plans to establish two GST tribunal benches to expedite the resolution of tax issues, aiming for them to be operational by August-September.			
	<ul> <li>Each bench will consist of four members, including one from the state, one from the Centre, and two independent judicial members.</li> <li>These tribunals will settle tax matters concerning West Bengal, Sikkim, and the Andaman and Nicobar Islands.</li> <li>Vivek Jalan, chairperson of the National Fiscal Affairs &amp; Taxation Committee of The Bengal Chamber of Commerce and Industry, mentioned that 50 such benches are expected to be set up nationwide.</li> <li>The process was delayed due to discussions between states and the Centre.</li> <li>Currently, traders with disputes must first seek settlement at the state departmental level and then, if necessary, in the High Court, which is often overburdened.</li> <li>The introduction of GST tribunals is expected to expedite the justice delivery process.</li> </ul>

### Context:

- Kolkata Municipal Corporation (KMC) has identified 69 wards for a malaria awareness programme.
- The week-long programme, starting 26th April, aims to raise awareness about malaria protection and eradication.

## About:

- Malaria is caused by the **Plasmodium parasite**.
- It spreads to humans through bites of infected female "night-biting" Anopheles mosquitoes, known as mosquitoes.

#### Malaria in India:

- India accounted for 66% of malaria cases in the WHO's South-East Asia region in 2022.
- India and Indonesia accounted for about 94% of all malaria deaths in the region last year.
- Nearly 46% of all cases in the region were caused by Plasmodium vivax.

### Government Efforts to Control Malaria in India:

- Since 2000, India has reduced malaria cases by more than half and malaria deaths by more than 66%.
- Introduced the National Framework for Malaria Elimination (2016-2030) in 2016.
- Aims for a malaria-free country by 2027 and elimination by 2030.
- Increased funding by more than 25% for the National **Vector Borne Disease Control Programme in 2019.**
- Increased support as a donor to the Global Fund to Fight AIDS, Tuberculosis, and Malaria.



### **Heat Wave:**

- Qualitatively, a heat wave is a condition of air temperature that becomes fatal to the human body when exposed.
- Quantitatively, it is defined based on the temperature thresholds over a region in terms of actual temperature or its departure from normal.
- Heatwave is considered if the maximum temperature of a station reaches at least 40°C or more for Plains and at least 30°C or more for Hilly regions.

# a) Based on Departure from Normal

- Heat Wave: Departure from normal is 4.5°C to 6.4°C
- Severe Heat Wave: Departure from normal is >6.4°C

# b) Based on Actual Maximum Temperature

- Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature ≥ 45°C
- Severe Heat Wave: When actual maximum temperature ≥47°C
- India Meteorological Department issues following colour code impact based heat
- warning jointly with National Disaster Management Authority.

Colour Code	Alert	Warning	Impact	Suggested Actions
Green (No action)	Normal Day	Maximum temperatures are near normal	Comfortable temperature. No cautionary action required.	Nii
Yellow Alert (Be updated)	Heat Alert	Heat wave conditions at isolated pockets persists on 2 days	Moderate temperature. Heat is tolerable for general public but moderate health concern for vulnerable people e.g. infants, elderly, people with chronic diseases	(a) Avoid heat exposure. (b) Wear lightweight, light- coloured, loose, cotton clothes. (c) Cover your head: Use a cloth, hat or umbrella
Orange Alert (Be prepared)	Severe Heat Alert for the day	(i) Severe heat wave conditions persists for 2 days (ii) Through not severe, but heat wave persists for 4 days or more	High temperature. Increased likelihood of heat illness symptoms in people who are either exposed to sun for a prolonged period or doing heavy work.
