| BCDA Opposes Centre's Proposal to Sell OTC Drugs in Grocery Stores | Context: • Bengal Chemists and Druggists Association (BCDA) strongly opposed the Central government's proposal to sell over-the-counter (OTC) drugs in general and grocery stores. |

| | Key points: The Union government suggested amending Schedule K of the Drugs and Cosmetics Act to allow OTC drug sales in general and grocery stores without a prescription. |
| | BCDA's Concerns: Public Health Risks: BCDA believes selling approximately 400 OTC drug compositions, including antibiotics and habit-forming drugs, in general stores could lead to misuse due to the lack of pharmacist oversight. Violation of Laws: They argue that this proposal would violate existing drug and cosmetics laws, pharmacy regulations, and Supreme Court directives. Existing Infrastructure: BCDA claims that India's current network of 12.40 lakh retail chemists and 13.5 lakh pharmacists is sufficient to handle OTC drug needs. Request to Centre: BCDA urged the Centre to consult stakeholders before implementing any changes to the OTC drug sales policy. Impact on Society: Sajal Gangopadhyay, BCDA's General Secretary, emphasized the risks of allowing OTC drug sales without proper regulation, including drug abuse, self-medication, and compromised storage. Current Status: The government has identified around 400 compositions, including antibiotics and nasal sprays, to be sold over the counter. Presently, about 60 drugs under Schedule K are available without a prescription. |
