Sprinklers have been set up for birds and smaller animals like lemurs.</li> <li>Seasonal Adjustments: Depending on the season, the zoo adapts its measures, providing blankets and heaters in winter. Calcutta High Court Decision on OBC Certificates	<ul> <li>Context: <ul> <li>The Calcutta High Court has declared all OBC certificates issued in West Bengal since 2010 as illegal.</li> </ul> </li> <li>About: <ul> <li>This ruling comes as a result of a public interest litigation challenging the process of granting these certificates.</li> <li>The court struck down sections of the West Bengal Backward Classes (Other than Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes) (Reservation of Vacancies in Services and Posts) Act, 2012, deeming them unconstitutional.</li> <li>Certificates issued before 2010 remain unaffected, and the order does not impact those already benefiting from reservations.</li> </ul> </li> </ul>
