Jaldapara National Park Enhances	Context:
Grassland Habitat with New Species	 Jaldapara National Park is enhancing its grassland habitat by introducing eight new grass species. This initiative aims to eliminate monoculture and restore the diverse grass species that once thrived in the park, ensuring a varied food supply for herbivores.
	About:
	 Jaldapara National Park is situated at the foothills of the Eastern Himalayas in the Alipurduar District of northern West Bengal and on the banks of the Torsa River.
	 The area was declared as a wildlife sanctuary in 1941 for the protection of the Indian One-Horned Rhino, and in 2012, it was declared as a National Park.
	 It houses a diversity of flora and fauna including mixed deciduous forests, grasslands and riverbanks which houses herds of Bison, Hispid hare, Hog deer, Sambar, and Asian elephants amongst other animals.
Ramkeli Mela	Context:
	• The Malda district administration is set to unveil a detailed map of the historic Ramkeli Mela on June 14, aimed at aiding the numerous pilgrims who visit the fair annually.
	Historical Significance:
	 The Ramkeli Mela commemorates the arrival of Sri Chaitanya Mahaprabhu, the revered Vishnav saint, to Gour, the ancient capital of Bengal. Sri Chaitanya Dev arrived in Ramkeli Village in 1515 on his way to Mathura and Vrindavan to preach 'Bhakti Dharma' and stayed with his followers, Roop and Sanatan.

	 Since then, the traditional Ramkeli fair has been held on 'Jaistha Sankranti' of the Bengali calendar to honor his holy arrival.
North Bengal Celebrates International Everest Day	Context: • North Bengal commemorated International Everest Day, a day that marks the historic first ascent of Mount Everest by Tenzing Norgay Sherpa and Sir Edmund Hillary on May 29, 1953.
	 About: On May 29, the world will observe International Everest Day in memory of Nepalese Tenzing Norgay and New Zealand's Edmund Hillary, the first individuals to conquer the formidable Mt. Everest in 1953. The origins of International Everest Day can be traced back to 2008, the year when Edmund Hillary passed away. It was then that Nepal decided to commemorate May 29 as a day to honor the extraordinary feat accomplished by Norgay and Hillary.
Hindi Journalism Day	Context: • On May 30, the first Hindi newspaper in India, Udant Martand (The Rising Sun), was launched from Calcutta.
	 Key points: Udant Martand was published by Pandit Jugal Kishore Shukla, a lawyer from Kanpur who was employed at the Sadr Diwani Adalat in Calcutta. He saw a pressing need for a Hindi newspaper for the Hindi-speaking community in Calcutta. At that time, newspapers in English and several other Indian languages had already been established. Udant Martand was notable for being the first newspaper published entirely in Hindi, utilizing the Devanagari script. It incorporated a blend of Khari Boli and Brajbhasha dialects, making it accessible to a broad Hindi-speaking audience.
