West Bengal Governor Directs Chief Minister to Submit Report on Scams	 Context: West Bengal Governor C V Ananda Bose has directed Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee to promptly submit a detailed report on the ongoing investigations into various scams, as per an official statement from the Raj Bhavan. Key points: The Governor is the Executive Head of the State within the meaning of Articles 153 and 154 of the Constitution of India. Article 167 - Duties of Chief Minister as respects the furnishing of information to Governor, etc It shall be the duty of the Chief Minister of each State- (a) to communicate to the Governor of the State all decisions of the Council of Ministers relating to the administration of the affairs of the State and proposals for legislation; (b) to furnish such information relating to the administration of the affairs of the State and proposals for legislation as the Governor may call for; and (c) if the Governor so requires, to submit for the consideration of the Council of Ministers any matter on which a decision has been taken by a Minister but which has not been considered by the Council.
Bank of Bengal	 Context: On June 2, 1806, the Bank of Calcutta was established by the British East India Company, later renamed the Bank of Bengal. About: Subsequently, the Bank of Bombay was founded on April 15, 1840, and the Bank of Madras on July 1, 1843. Initially, these banks operated as unit banks, but in 1862, they transitioned to branch banking, establishing branches in various ports and trade centers across British India. On January 27, 1921, the three banks were amalgamated to form the Imperial Bank of India, which became an all-India bank. Finally, on July 1, 1955, the Imperial Bank of India was nationalized and rebranded as the State Bank of India, becoming the premier commercial bank in the country.

Vidya Vahan	 Context: The software 'Vidya Vahan,' developed by the Centre for Development of Advanced Computing (C-DAC), may soon be adopted by West Bengal, making it the second state after Kerala to do so.
	 About: The software enables parents to track pool cars and school buses, enhancing road safety and security for school children. In Kerala, where it was first launched in 2023, the government provided the app free to parents. In a recent meeting between the West Bengal Transport Department and C-DAC, there was a discussion about encouraging school administrators and parents to use software like Vidya Vahan for real-time tracking of these vehicles. Although the app is yet to be launched in Bengal, workshops are scheduled for stakeholders after June 5 to familiarize them with the software.
