SOUT CHIRE NINE-DASH LINE	 A Chinese vessel and a Philippine supply ship collided near the disputed Spratly Islands in the South China Sea. The incident occurred when a Philippine supply ship entered waters near the Second Thomas Shoal, a submerged reef in the Spratly Islands, which is claimed by multiple nations. About the South China Sea: Location: The South China Sea is a marginal sea of the Western Pacific Ocean, bordered by China, Taiwan, the Philippines, Malaysia, Brunei, Indonesia, Singapore, and Vietnam. Trade Routes: It is one of the world's busiest sea lanes, with over one-third of global maritime trade passing through it, including vital oil and gas shipments. Territorial Disputes: Claimants: The South China Sea is subject to overlapping territorial claims by China, the Philippines, Vietnam, Malaysia, Brunei, and Taiwan. Nine-Dash Line: China's extensive claim is marked by the "nine-dash line," which covers most of the South China Sea. Key Areas: Disputed regions include the Spratly Islands, Paracel Islands, Scarborough Shoal, and the Second Thomas Shoal.

	 About COM: The Council of Ministers (COM) in India is a body of ministers that includes the Prime Minister and other appointed ministers. It is responsible for the executive functions of the government. Formation: The Council of Ministers is formed by the President of India on the advice of the Prime Minister. Constitutional Provision: Article 74 and Article 75 of the Indian Constitution deal with the Council of Ministers. Article 74 states that there shall be a Council of Ministers headed by the Prime Minister to aid and advise the President. Types of Ministers: Cabinet Ministers: Senior ministers in charge of major ministries. Ministers of State (Independent Charge): Ministers who manage specific portfolios independently without a cabinet minister. Ministers of State: Junior ministers who assist cabinet ministers in their portfolios.
