'Mithili' storm forms in the Bay of Bengal	Context:	
	<ul> <li>Cyclone Mithili formed over the Bay of Bengal and made landfall near Khepupara, Bangladesh</li> <li>It brought heavy rain and strong winds to the coastal areas of Odisha, West Bengal, and Bangladesh.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>The low pressure area that had formed over the south Andaman Sea on November 14 quickly intensified into a depression the next day and into a deep depression on November 16.</li> <li>In the early hours of November 16, the system lay as a deep depression over west-central Bay of Bengal, 380 kilometres east-southeast of Visakhapatnam in Andhra Pradesh and 380 km south of Paradip in Odisha.</li> <li>The deep depression would move northnortheastwards and further intensify into a cyclone, the IMD predicted. The cyclone would be named 'Midhili' once it forms, a name contributed by the Maldives.</li> <li>Cyclone Midhili will be the second cyclone of the season in the Bay of Bengal after cyclone Hamoon in late October.</li> <li>Cyclone Hamoon made landfall along the Myanmar coast on the intervening night of October 24-25. It had changed its categories four times in day and kept the IMD on its toes.</li> </ul>
