About Moosa Raza:

- Mr. Raza was born in Meenambur village in Villupuram district, Tamil Nadu.
- He joined the Indian Administrative Service in **1960** after earning his honours in English language and literature from the University of Madras.
- He served the **Gujarat** and Central governments in various capacities, including the Principal Secretary to the Chief Minister of Gujarat and Chief Secretary, Government of Jammu and Kashmir.
- After retiring from Government service, he served as a member of the National Integration Council of India.

	 About St. Vallalar: St. Vallalar, was a notable Tamil saint and poet of the 19th century. Born on October 5, 1823, in Marudur, near Chidambaram, Tamil Nadu. He belonged to a line of Tamil saints known as "gnana siddhars", which means 'higher wisdom'. He founded a group known as "Samarasa Suddha Sanmarga Sathiya Sangam" to eliminate caste in India.
