Specialised courts in the Union Territory of Puducherry

Why in news?

- Lieutenant Governor of Puducherry, in consultation with the High Court of Judicature at Madras, issued orders to establish various specialised courts across the Union Territory of Puducherry.
- A Court of Judicial Magistrate (Mahila Court) has been established in Puducherry District to address cases concerning women.

Key points:

- Special courts have been designated to preside over cases involving members of parliament and members of the Puducherry legislative assembly.
- These specialised courts will be functional after the **posting of judicial officers**.

About Specialised courts:

- Legislative Authority: The constitution of Special Courts and their functioning fall within the domain of the State and Union Territory Governments.
- Consultation with High Courts: The State and UT Governments set up such courts as per their need and resources, in consultation with the High Courts.

Tamil Nadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNSCZMA)

Why in news?

- The National Green Tribunal (NGT) has directed the Tamil Nadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNSCZMA) to correct the 'incomplete' draft Coastal Zone Management Plans (CZMPs).
- The correction should incorporate long-term housing plans for coastal communities as per the guidelines prescribed in the CRZ Notification, 2019.

About Tamil Nadu State Coastal Zone Management Authority (TNSCZMA):

• The TNSCZMA is responsible for enforcing and monitoring the Coastal Regulation

Zone (CRZ) regulations.

- Its primary objective is to protect and improve the coastal environment and promote sustainable development along the coastal areas of Tamil Nadu.
- The authority was established under the provisions of the Environment Protection Act, 1986.
- Responsibilities:
 - Implementing the CRZ notifications.
 - Approving and regulating development activities within the coastal zones.
 - Ensuring the protection of the coastal environment including the conservation of coastal and marine biodiversity.

The Goondas Act 1982

Why in news?

- The Tamil Nadu Prevention of Dangerous Activities of Bootleggers, Cyber Law Offenders, Drug Offenders, Forest Offenders, Goondas, Immoral Traffic Offenders, Sand Offenders, Sexual Offenders, Slum Grabbers and Video Pirates Act of 1982 is commonly referred to as the Goondas Act or Act 14 of 1982.
- The Madras High Court receives numerous habeas corpus petitions challenging the detention orders passed under the Goondas Act.

Key points:

- It is a preventive detention law.
- The law empowers the State to detain people in prison without a trial.
- The purpose of the law is to prevent dangerous activities that are prejudicial to the maintenance of public order.
- The Goondas Act is **similar to the National Security Act (NSA) of 1980**, which was enacted by the Parliament to maintain public order and national security.

About the Goondas Act 1982:

- The Act is designed to prevent dangerous activities of individuals involved in various forms of criminal behavior including bootlegging, cyber crimes, drug
- trafficking, forest offense, goondaism (a term used in India to describe habitual offenders), immoral trafficking, illegal sand mining, sexual offenses, slum grabbing, and video piracy.
- The decision to detain a person under this Act can be made by district magistrates, commissioners of police, or other specially empowered officers in the state of Tamil Nadu.

Tamil Nadu Panchayat Simplified Accounting System (TNPASS)

Why in news?

• Grassroots level administration in the state has been affected due to the

non-release of funds to panchayats since February.

- This has made it difficult for local bodies to meet their day-to-day expenditure.
- The department adopted the 'Tamil Nadu Panchayat Simplified Accounting System (TNPASS)', to bring tax collections in local bodies under a single window system.

About TNPASS:

- It is a significant initiative implemented by the state government to streamline the financial management and accounting processes of local governing bodies.
- TNPASS aims to simplify the accounting procedures for Village Panchayats in **Tamil Nadu**, ensuring transparency, accountability, and effective financial management.
- Under this system, the tax revenue generated by a panchayat will be maintained in one account, and the Director of the Rural Development Department will release it to the panchayats.

State Information Commission

Why in news?

• The Tamil Nadu State Information Commission awarded a compensation of Rs 10,000 to RTI activist.

key points:


- The State Chief Information Commissioner cited a Supreme Court order (Girish Ramchandra Deshpande vs Central Information Commission) and directed the PIO to furnish the number of pending memos against the RTO staffers, For not providing information.
- The information commissioner directed the commissionerate's PIO to pay Rs 10,000 as compensation.

About State Information Commission:

- State Information Commissions are established under the **Right to Information (RTI)** Act, 2005.
- Purpose: The SICs are created to promote transparency and accountability in the working of every public authority by ensuring the effective implementation of the RTI Act.
- Each State Information Commission is headed by a State Chief Information Commissioner.
- Information Commissioners (ICs): The CIC is assisted by State Information Commissioners. The number of ICs varies by state but cannot exceed ten.
- The CIC and ICs are appointed by the Governor of the respective state.
- The selection committee for appointment consists of the Chief Minister, the Leader of the Opposition in the Legislative Assembly, and a Cabinet Minister nominated by the Chief Minister

Why in news?

- The Tamil Nadu Chamber of Commerce and Industry and the National Accreditation Board for Testing and Calibration Laboratories (NABL) conducted an awareness programme for food testing laboratories.
- The focus of the programme was on NABL accreditation and its benefits.

About NABL:

- Establishment:
 - NABL is an autonomous body under the Department of Science & Technology, Government of India.
 - It was established with the objective of providing accreditation to laboratories in India.
- Purpose:
 - NABL accredits testing and calibration laboratories in accordance with ISO/IEC 17025 standards.
 - It ensures the quality and reliability of tests and calibrations performed in accredited laboratories.

International Recognition:

- NABL is a signatory to international organizations like ILAC (International Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation) and APLAC (Asia Pacific Laboratory Accreditation Cooperation).
- This ensures that NABL accredited laboratories' results are globally accepted.

Appointment of Acting Chief Justice of Madras High Court

Why in news?

- President Droupadi Murmu has appointed Justice R. Mahadevan, the seniormost puisne judge of the Madras High Court, to perform the duties of the office of the Chief Justice of the High Court.
- The incumbent Chief Justice, Sanjay V. Gangapurwala, is set to retire.
- The **Union Ministry of Law and Justice** has issued a notification announcing the President's decision.

About Appointment of Acting Chief Justice of High Court:

- Appointment Authority: The President of India appoints the Acting Chief Justice of a High Court.
- Circumstances for Appointment:
 - When the office of the Chief Justice of a High Court is vacant.
 - When the Chief Justice is unable to perform their duties due to absence or any other reason.
- Eligibility:
 - Typically, the senior-most judge of the High Court is appointed as the Acting

Chief Justice.

- Must meet the qualifications required for a High Court judge as per the Constitution of India.
- Duties and Responsibilities: Perform all duties and exercise the powers of the Chief Justice of the High Court.
- Term Duration: The Acting Chief Justice serves until a new Chief Justice is appointed or the current Chief Justice resumes duties.
- Constitutional Provisions: Governed by Article 223 of the Constitution of India.
- Procedure:
 - The process is initiated by the Collegium of the Supreme Court, which makes recommendations to the President.
 - The **Ministry of Law and Justice** is involved in the formalities and issuance of the appointment order.

Central Advisory Contract Labour Board

Why in news?

- The Central Advisory Contract Labour Board, under the Union Ministry of Labour and Employment, has constituted a committee.
- The committee will address the issue of abolishing contract labour for packing, loading, and incidental works at Chennai airport.

Reason for Committee Formation:

- Followed a judgment by the Madras High Court.
- The directive was to consider the representation made by the International Air Cargo Workers Union (IACWU) regarding the issue.


About Central Advisory Contract Labour Board:

- Purpose: The Central Advisory Contract Labour Board advises the Central Government on matters related to the administration of the Contract Labour (Regulation and Abolition) Act, 1970.
- **Composition**: The Board consists of representatives from employers, employees, the central and state governments, and independent members.
- Functions:
 - Reviews and makes recommendations on the working conditions of contract labour.
 - Suggests measures for improving the welfare of contract labour.
 - Advises on the abolition or regulation of contract labour in specific industries or establishments.

Urban Greening Policy

Why in news?

- The State government of Tamil Nadu is drafting an exclusive 'Urban Greening Policy' to coordinate and streamline greening projects and tree planting programmes carried out in cities across the state.
- This new policy is being prepared as part of the Green Tamil Nadu Mission.

Key points:

- The mission has been given a task to plant 265 crore trees across the state in 10 years to increase the green cover of the state to 33 per cent from the present 23.69 per cent.
- The new policy will lay norms for planting trees, selection of species, tree planting sites, maintenance methodology, permissions to be obtained and other aspects.
- This initiative is in line with the 2024-2025 budget, which includes various initiatives such as
 - Planting of tall trees,
 - Miyawaki forests,
 - Green roofs,
 - Vertical gardens,
 - Green subways,
 - o Green screens, and
 - Planting trees along pedestrian pavements
- It is to expand green spaces across all corporations and municipalities in Tamil Nadu, including the Greater Chennai Corporation (GCC).

36 species spotted across seven locations in Thamirabarani

Why in news?

- The Thamirabarani Fish Count (TFC), an ichthyological survey of fish in the Thamirabarani, found nearly 36 different fish species and 1,197 individual fishes.
- The survey was conducted by the Ashoka Trust for Research in Ecology and the Environment (ATREE)'s Agasthyamalai Community Conservation Centre (ACCC), in collaboration with the Sri Paramakalyani Centre for Environmental Sciences, and the Department of Zoology of Sadakathullah Appa College, Palayamkottai.

Key points:

- This is ATREE's first annual survey, aimed at documenting native fish species, identifying invasive species, and outlining effective conservation strategies.
- Among the 36 species, 31 were identified as native species, two introduced, and three invasive species.
- Endemic species such as the Thamirabarani Barb, Mahseer, Half Beak fish, and **Torrent Catfish were sighted.**
- Invasive species such as the Pleco Tank Cleaner and African Catfish were found in significant numbers between Thirupudaimaruthur and Srivaikuntam

Pollution Under Control Certificates (PUCC) version 2.0

Why in news?

 The Tamil Nadu state transport department has launched a web-based Pollution Under Control Certificates (PUCC) version 2.0 to check air pollution and curb violations.

Key points:

- The new version ensures that the mobile phone linked to the PUCC version 2.0 should be present at the geo-tagged location of the centres as the App will work only within 30 metres from the centre.
- A picture of the vehicles with number plates while testing the emissions and a
 picture of the vehicle along with the certified person who tests the emission and
 name board of the center should be uploaded.
- Also, video clips of testing should be uploaded.
- Tamil Nadu is the third state in the country to launch PUCC Version 2.0.
- The new system will come into effect from May 6

Monitor lizard (Varanus bengalensis)

Why in news?

- The wildlife officials in Tamil Nadu seized more than 300 monitor lizard skins from different districts.
- These skins were intended for making the percussion instrument kanjira.

Key points:

- The state wildlife crime control bureau raided shops selling musical instruments.
- The shop owners informed officials about the source of the monitor lizard skins, which made kanjiras.
- Monitor lizard (Varanus bengalensis) is protected under Schedule I of the Wildlife Protection Act.
- As per the provisions of the Act, illegal possession and trade of any Scheduled species, or parts thereof, is a punishable offence that attracts imprisonment for up to seven years.

New species of jumping spiders discovered

Why in news?

- Researchers recently discovered a new species of jumping spiders in Tamil Nadu were named Stenaelurillus feral (from Villupuram) and Stenaelurillus judithblesternae (from Coimbatore).
- Also other two species found in Solapur and Dharashiv districts of Maharashtra, named Stenaelurillus solapur and Stenaelurillus naldurg were found only in the habitat they were discovered in.

Key points:

- The spiders were found in a compact and fragmented semi-arid grassland patch.
- The species of spiders lived secluded in colonies and were rare to find.
- Researchers conducted the exploration of the species in the Western Ghats,
 Deccan Plateau and the eastern coastal region.
- Jumping spiders play a crucial role in maintaining the ecological balance.
- Acting as predators, they help control the population of insects and other arthropods, thus reducing the spread of diseases and damage to crops.

Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Plan of Tamil Nadu - Forest Habitat Suitability

Why in news?

• The Centre for Climate Change and Disaster Management (CCCDM), Anna University, prepared a draft report titled 'Climate Vulnerability Assessment and Adaptation Plan of Tamil Nadu - Forest Habitat Suitability'.

Key points:

- The report predicts that by 2050, evergreen and deciduous forest areas in Tamil Nadu, mainly in the Western and Eastern Ghats, may reduce by 32% and 18% respectively.
- At the same time, the suitability for thorn forests is expected to increase by 71%.
- The degradation is primarily due to high temperature, altered rainfall pattern, and prolonged dry spells in the post-monsoon season.

Spotted deer

Why in news?

• A total of 26 **spotted deer** were released into the wild at the **Siruvani foothills**, which fall under the **Boluvampatti forest range**.

About spotted deer:

- Species and Habitat:
 - The spotted deer, or chital/cheetal, is a deer species native to the Indian subcontinent.
 - It is the most common deer species in Indian forests.
 - Its habitat includes subtropical grasslands and forests.
- Distribution:
 - It is widely distributed in Asia, especially in India, Sri Lanka, Bangladesh, Bhutan, and a small group in Pakistan.
- Conservation Status:
 - According to the IUCN Red List, the conservation status of the spotted deer is classified as 'Least Concern'

Ariosoma Thoothukudiense

Why in news?

- Ariosoma Thoothukudiense is a new species of Congrid Eel that was discovered at the Thoothukudi fishing harbour.
- This discovery was made by marine biologists and was led by research scholar P Kodeeswaran.



About Ariosoma Thoothukudiense:

- The eels were captured at a depth of 60 metres, off the Thoothukudi coast.
- The species is expected to be distributed in the Indian Ocean.
- The new species differs from all the congeners of Indian waters in that it has more total vertebrae, except A. Albimaculatum.
- The new species is closely related to Ariosoma Maurostigma and Ariosoma **Albimaculatum**

Hump-backed mahseer

Why in news?

• The hump-backed mahseer species is restricted to the Cauvery river system and is currently under threat due to reservoirs, sand mining, and pollution.



About Hump-backed mahseer:

- Scientific Name: Tor remadevii
- Common Names: Hump-backed Mahseer, Orange-finned Mahseer, Deccan Mahseer, also known as 'Tiger of Cauvery'.
- Conservation Status: Critically Endangered
- Habitat: Endemic to the Western Ghats of India, primarily found in the Cauvery River basin.
- **Diet**: Omnivorous, feeding on a variety of plant material, small fish, and invertebrates.
- Reproduction: Spawns during the monsoon season when water levels rise.

Draft elephant corridor plan of Tamil Nadu

Why in news?

• The Tamil Nadu Vivasayigal Sangam has opposed the draft elephant corridor plan recently released by the forest department.

About draft elephant corridor plan:

- The draft elephant corridor plan was released by the Tamil Nadu government and the forest department.
- The plan was prepared in response to increasing cases of human-elephant conflicts and aims at restoring habitat connectivity for the substantial elephant population in the state.
- The Elephant Corridor Committee identified a 53.8 km stretch in the Anthiyur -Chennampatti forests in Erode division, and a 3 km stretch in the Sujilkuttai -Bannari forests, falling under the Sathyamangalam Tiger Reserve (STR), as corridors frequently used by wild elephants.
- The plan addresses critical disruptions to the elephant corridors.
- The draft plan proposes to relocate the shooting range, maintain the elephant proof trenches, fill up the water troughs in the corridor, monitor the four paper industries located near the corridor to prevent the discharge of effluents into water bodies and also acquire patta land to widen the width of the corridor so that elephant can travel through easily.

Lion-tailed macaques

Why in news?

- Lion-tailed macaques, a species of shy primates, are leaving their forest habitats and moving into Valparai in search of food.
- These primates have **lost their fear of humans**.

Key points:

- This change in behavior is attributed to several factors:
 - Habitat degradation: The natural habitats of these macaques are being destroyed.
 - Roads through habitats: The construction of roads through their habitats has disrupted their living conditions.
 - o Increased vehicular movement: The increase in traffic and human activity in their habitats has affected their behavior.
 - Food offered by tourists: Tourists feeding these macagues have made them dependent on human food.
 - o Improper waste management: The improper disposal of waste has attracted these macaques to human settlements.

About Lion-tailed macaques:

- Scientific Name: Macaca silenus
- Common Name: Lion-tailed macague
- Habitat: Primarily found in the tropical rainforests of the Western Ghats in India.
- Behavior:
 - Arboreal and diurnal.

- Live in social groups of 10-20 individuals.
- Known for their loud calls and complex vocalizations.

Pygmy killer whale

Why in news?

• A **Pygmy killer whale** was found stranded near the Thoothukudi shore in the **Narippaiyur area of Mannar Marine National Park**.



About Pygmy killer whale:

- Scientific Name: Feresa attenuata
- Family: Delphinidae
- Conservation Status: Data Deficient (IUCN Red List)
- **Appearance**: Dark gray to black with a lighter underside. They have rounded heads and a small, slender body. There is a white patch on the belly and lips.
- **Dorsal Fin**: Tall and falcate (curved backward).
- **Diet**: **Carnivorous**, primarily feeding on fish and squid.
- Behavior: Known to be elusive and rarely seen. They can be aggressive towards other dolphins and whales.
- Habitat: Prefer deep, warm tropical and subtropical waters.
- **Geographic Range**: Found in oceans worldwide, including the Atlantic, Pacific, and Indian Oceans.

Chromium contamination

Why in news?

 A Public Interest Litigation (PIL) petition has been filed in the Madras High Court, to seek a direction to the Centre and the State government to take immediate remediation steps towards reported chromium contamination at a defunct factory of Tamil Nadu Chromate and Chemicals Limited (TNCCL) in Ranipet.

About Chromium contamination:

Overview:

Chromium contamination refers to the presence of chromium, a toxic heavy metal, in the environment, particularly in soil and water.





Tourism survey in Tamil Nadu


Why in news?

- The Tamil Nadu Tourism Department, in collaboration with the United Nations World Tourism Organisation (UNWTO), will conduct a tourism survey in all 38 districts of the state for the first time.
- The proposed survey will collect information from tourist destinations, exit points, and accommodations.

Key points:

- The survey aims to assess the internal tourism volume in accordance with the definition prescribed by the UNWTO.
- This includes counting exercises at the entry gates and entry points of the destination, assessing the average number of destinations visited and intended to be visited in the district, and the place of stay of leisure visitors.
- The survey will also be conducted at exit points of the district, such as railway stations, bus stands, and airports.
- The whole survey will be conducted through volunteers and locals in each district.

Why in news?

• Start-ups have increased four-fold in 3 years in Tamil Nadu.

Key points:

- A total of 6,384 start-ups have been established in the state.
- The Tamil Nadu Startup and Innovation Policy was introduced in 2023.
- The number of start-ups registered in the state has increased four-fold from 2,032 in 2021 to 8,416 at present.
- The number of start-ups led by women has also increased from 966 to 3,163 in the same period.
- Tamil Nadu was ranked first by the centre for creating a favourable environment for start-ups.

Severe Water Crisis Hits South India

Context:

- South India, particularly Tamil Nadu, is grappling with an acute water shortage this summer, with live water storage levels plummeting to a critical 16% of the total capacity.
- According to a May 2 report by the Central Water Commission (CWC), this figure stands starkly below the national average of 28%. The report highlights the dire situation across 42 reservoirs in the southern states of Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, Karnataka, and Kerala, collectively holding only 8.353 billion cubic meters out of a potential 53.334 billion.
- This year's storage levels not only fall short compared to last year's 28% but also dip below the ten-year average of 22%.

- The CWC monitors a network of 150 major reservoirs nationwide, which collectively showed a significant drop from 69.35% capacity in January to 28% currently, influenced by factors such as irrigation demands, drinking water provision, and evaporation.

About Hogenakkal drinking water project:

- The Hogenakkal drinking water project, officially known as the **Hogenakkal Water** Supply and Fluorosis Mitigation Project, is a significant initiative in Tamil Nadu.
- The main goal of the project is to provide safe drinking water to the Dharmapuri and Krishnagiri districts of Tamil Nadu, which are affected by high fluoride content in groundwater causing fluorosis.
- The water for this project is sourced from the River Cauvery at Hogenakkal, which is on the border of Tamil Nadu and Karnataka.
- One of the primary health objectives is to mitigate the effects of fluorosis, a disease caused by fluoride ingestion, which affects bones and teeth

Tamil Nadu Urban Habitat Development Board (TNUHDB)

Why in news?

- The **Tamil Nadu government** has announced **plans to construct 31,000 flats** at an estimated cost of Rs 8.000 crore.

- While officials attributed the delay in the commissioning of the rooftop solar plants to the ongoing Lok Sabha elections, sources said the actual reason was glitches in the national portal.

About PM - Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana:

- The scheme, also known as PM Surya Ghar: Muft Bijli Yojana, aims to provide free electricity to households in India.
- It was launched by Prime Minister on February 15, 2024.
- Under the scheme, households are provided with a subsidy to install solar panels on their roofs.
- The subsidy covers up to 40% of the cost of the solar panels.
- The scheme is **expected to benefit 1 crore households** across India.
- It is estimated that the scheme will save the government Rs. 75,000 crore per year in electricity costs.

Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS)

Why in news?

- The Tamil Nadu government revised the wage rate for the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Scheme (MGNREGS).
- The Tamil Nadu government issued an order on Friday to revise the wage rate for MGNREGS from Rs 294 to Rs 319 per person per day.

About MGNREGS:

- MGNREGS is an Indian social security measure aimed at guaranteeing the 'right to work'.
- It was launched in 2006 by the Ministry of Rural Development, Government of India.
- Objective: The primary objective is to enhance livelihood security in rural areas by providing at least 100 days of wage employment in a financial year to every household whose adult members volunteer to do unskilled manual work.
- MGNREGS is implemented under the Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, 2005.
- The scheme is applicable to all rural areas of India.
- It is a **centrally sponsored scheme** with the central government bearing the majority of the costs.
- Every registered household is provided with a job card, which entitles them to apply for work and record the number of days worked.

West Nile fever

About West Nile fever:

- Cause and Transmission:
 - West Nile fever is caused by the West Nile virus, which is part of the Flaviviridae family.
 - It is primarily transmitted to humans through the bites of infected mosquitoes, with the Culex species being the most common vector.
- Symptoms:
 - Many people infected with West Nile virus do not show symptoms.
 - Less than 1% of infected people develop a serious neurological illness such as encephalitis or meningitis.
- West Nile virus is found in Africa, Europe, the Middle East, North America, and West Asia.

Yellow fever

Cauvery Water Regulation Committee

Why in news?

- The Tamil Nadu government has decided to take legal action against Karnataka for refusing to release water, as the state is facing a water crisis with low reservoir levels.
- The government is seeking the intervention of the Supreme Court to resolve the dispute.
- This move comes after the **Cauvery Water Regulation Committee** recommended the release of water from Karnataka reservoirs.

About Cauvery Water Regulation Committee:

- The Cauvery Water Regulation Committee (CWRC) is an essential body established to oversee the implementation of water sharing and regulation among the states in the Cauvery River basin.

Artificially-ripened mangoes

Why in news?

• The Food Safety Department of Tamil Nadu is continuing its drive against the sale of artificially-ripened mangoes.

About Artificially-ripened mangoes:

- Artificially ripened mangoes are often treated with chemicals like calcium carbide to speed up the ripening process.
- Ripening Agents: Common chemicals used include calcium carbide, ethylene gas, and ethephon.
- Calcium carbide is strictly prohibited under the FSSAI's Prohibition and Restrictions on Sales Regulation, 2011.
- The chemical has traces of arsenic and phosphorous hydride, which may result in vomiting, diarrhea, weakness, ulcers on the skin, permanent eye damage, and shortness of breath.
- Artificially ripened mangoes often have a uniform color and may appear more yellow or orange than naturally ripened ones.

Decentralised Seed Multiplier (DSM)

Why in news?

- The ICAR-Central Tuber Crops Research Institute (ICAR-CTCRI) is planning to expand a **Decentralised Seed Multiplier (DSM) programme** to more States.
- The programme aims to ensure the availability of good quality planting material of tropical tuber crops.
- Currently, the Decentralised Seed Multiplier (DSM) programme is being implemented in Kerala, Tamil Nadu, Andhra Pradesh, and Odisha.

Manual scavenging

Why in news?

- The Madras High Court expressed concern over the conditions of conservancy workers employed in manual scavenging and the resultant deaths.
- The court issued a set of 19 guidelines to the government to effectively deal with the issue and asked to **eradicate the practice by at least 2026**.

Key points:

- The court acknowledged the **right of a human corpse for decent burial/cremation** and **right to sleep as fundamental rights**, but noted that the practice of manual scavenging still persists.
- The court termed manual scavenging as a bane on society that perpetuates the violation of human rights and dignity of marginalised communities.
- The guidelines included steps to ensure mechanisation of clearing of sewer, septic tank and stormwater drains
- The court urged the authorities to ensure strict implementation and compliance of the Prohibition of Employment as Manual Scavengers and their Rehabilitation Act, 2023.

'En Kalloori Kanavu' initiative

Why in news?

- The 'En Kalloori Kanavu' initiative has been launched by the Adi Dravidar and Tribal Welfare Department.
- The aim is to improve the higher education enrolment rate among students from the Scheduled Castes (SCs) and Scheduled Tribes (STs) communities and reduce the number of dropouts.

Key points:

- The initiative is a higher education and career guidance program.
- The program aims to help nearly 1.28 lakh SC and ST students who studied in government, government-aided, Adi Dravidar and tribal welfare schools in the State and appeared for the Class XII board exams.
- The department has also created a database of the various higher education courses available and mapped them district-wise to help students know the availability of various courses in the colleges near their locality.

Tamil Nadu Kasanoi Erappila Thittam (TN-KET)







Why in news?

- A study published in the Tamil Nadu Journal of Public Health and Medical Research suggests that therapeutic nutrition and inpatient care should be given to those with very severe undernutrition at TB diagnosis.
- 34 percent of incident TB in India is attributed to undernutrition.

Key points:

- Therapeutic nutrition involves liquid formula feeds that can be prepared in hospital kitchens using available ingredients.
- It should also be in line with the standards of the World Health Organisation and Central TB Division recommendations.
- The Tamil Nadu Kasanoi Erappila Thittam (TN-KET), a TB death-free initiative, has been implemented since April 2022, with an aim to reduce mortality due to TB.

About key features of the TN-KET initiative:

- **Differentiated TB Care**: This is at the heart of the initiative, which aims at assessing whether people with TB need ambulatory care or admission in a health facility to manage severe illness at the time of diagnosis.
- Radiological Assessment: The guidelines require comprehensive assessment of 16 clinical, laboratory, and radiological parameters.
- Triage of Assessment: The preliminary assessment of patients based on just three
 conditions very severe undernutrition, respiratory insufficiency, and inability to
 stand without support was found to be feasible for quick identification at diagnosis.

Fish processing units affecting quality of life

Context:

- Residents of Pottaloorani village in Ellainayakkanpatti panchayat, Thoothukudi, have filed a petition with the State Human Rights Commission (SHRC), demanding the revocation of licenses for three fish processing units accused of polluting the environment.
- This complaint arises from concerns over compromised hygiene, fresh air, and clean water. The village recently made headlines when locals boycotted the Lok Sabha elections on April 19, leading to a confrontation that **blocked Fisheries Minister Anitha R Radhakrishnan from entering the village.**

College Dream' Programme Launches in Tamil Nadu to Guide Students

Context:

• Tamil Nadu's 'College Dream' programme, initiated by Chief Minister MK Stalin under the 'Naan Mudhalvan' scheme, commenced today across multiple districts including Chennai, Trichy, and Coimbatore.

Aims:

 This initiative, aimed at helping students navigate their higher education options, follows the release of the Class 12 examination results.


