Ministry of Education Releases Report on Performance Grading Index 2.0 for States/UTs for the Year 2021-22

The Indian Education System is one of the largest globally, with millions of schools, teachers, and students from diverse backgrounds. The Ministry of Education has devised the Performance Grading Index (PGI) to assess the performance of the school education system at the state/UT level. The PGI provides a comprehensive analysis and creates an index for evaluating the education system.

Reasons for PGI 2.0:

The previous versions of PGI have become outdated and redundant.

- The new PGI 2.0 aligns with the National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 and monitors indicators related to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).
- It focuses on quality indicators, includes digital initiatives and teacher education, and utilizes data from UDISE+ for better uniformity and comparability.

Structure of PGI 2.0:

- PGI 2.0 comprises 73 indicators grouped into two categories: Outcomes and Governance Management (GM).
- These categories are further divided into six domains: Learning Outcomes (LO), Access (A), Infrastructure & Facilities (IF), Equity (E), Governance Process (GP), and Teachers Education and Training (TE&T).

Ministry of Education Releases Report on Performance Grading Index 2.0 for States/UTs for the Year 2021-22

- PGI 2.0 classifies States/UTs into ten grades.
- The highest achievable grade is Daksh, awarded to those scoring over 940 points out of a total of 1000.
- The lowest grade is Akanshi-3, given to those scoring up to 460 points.







Objectives of PGI 2.0:

- The aim is to encourage multi-pronged interventions to achieve optimal education outcomes.
- It helps identify gaps and prioritize areas for intervention in the school education system.
- Indicators are aligned with the NEP 2020 and policy initiatives for effective progress tracking.

Efficacy of PGI 2.0:

- PGI 2.0 scores and grades attained by States/UTs in 2021-22 showcase the effectiveness of the system.
- Indicator-wise scores highlight areas for improvement within each State/UT.

Key highlights in short

- The Ministry of Education has released the Performance Grading Index (PGI) 2.0 for States/UTs for the year 2021-22.
- PGI 2.0 replaces the previous versions and focuses on qualitative assessment, digital initiatives, and teacher education.

Wanindu Hasaranga, Ashleigh Gardner wins ICC 'Player of the Month' award

The International Cricket Council (ICC) announced Wanindu Hasaranga, the Sri Lankan spinner, and Ashleigh Gardner, the Australian women's team all-rounder, as the recipients of the 'Player of the Month' award for their remarkable performances in June. Hasaranga earned this honor for his outstanding achievements during the World Cup Qualifier matches in Zimbabwe, where he set new records. Ashleigh Gardner, the hero of the Women's Ashes, became the first player to win the Player-of-the-Month accolade three times.

Why Wanindu Hasaranga?

During the ICC World Cup Qualifiers, Wanindu Hasaranga played a crucial role in Sri Lanka's successful qualification for the 2023 ODI World Cup in India, scheduled to begin on September 5. Hasaranga emerged as the top wicket-taker in the qualifiers, impressively securing 22 wickets in 7 matches with an average of 12.90. He made a significant impact from the very start of the tournament, claiming six wickets against UAE in the opening match. He continued his remarkable performance with figures of 5-13 and 5-79 against Oman and Ireland, respectively. Notably, Hasaranga achieved a significant milestone by becoming the first spinner to achieve three consecutive fivewicket hauls in ODI history.

Why Ashleigh Gardner?

Ashleigh Gardner played a pivotal role in Australia's triumph in the Women's Ashes one-off Test match, where they emerged victorious by a margin of 89 runs. Gardner's contribution was instrumental in her team's success. In the first innings, she scored 40 runs and followed it up with a remarkable four-wicket haul. However, her most remarkable feat came in the second innings when she single-handedly secured the win for her country by taking eight wickets for just 66 runs. Gardner's exceptional performance proved to be the decisive factor in Australia's victory in the match.

How they selected?

A vote conducted among a specialist panel comprising ICC Hall of Famers, former international players, media representatives and global cricket fans registered at icc-cricket.com decided the winners, following the announcement of nominees last week.

Highlights of the 50th GST Council Meeting: Changes in **GST Rates and Compliance Measures**

The 50th Meeting of the GST Council, led by Union Finance & Corporate Affairs Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, marked a significant milestone in the journey of Goods and Services Tax (GST). The council discussed and recommended changes in GST tax rates, measures to facilitate trade, and streamline compliance processes. Here are the key highlights of the meeting.

Changes in GST Tax Rates:

I. Recommendations relating to GST rates on Goods:

A. Changes in GST rates of goods:

1. Uncooked/Unfried Snack Pellets: The rate on uncooked/unfried snack pellets will be reduced to 5%, and payment of GST for past periods will be regularized.

B. Other changes relating to goods:

- Dinutuximab (Quarziba) Medicine: IGST exemption will be provided for imported Dinutuximab (Quarziba) medicine for personal use.
- 2. Medicines and Food for Special Medical Purposes (FSMP): IGST exemption will be extended to imported medicines and FSMP used in the treatment of rare diseases listed under the National Policy for Rare Diseases, subject to existing conditions. The exemption will also apply to FSMP imported by Centers of Excellence for Rare Diseases or recommended institutions.







- 3. Supply of Raw Cotton: Supply of raw cotton, including kala cotton, by agriculturists to cooperatives will be taxable under reverse charge mechanism, and issues related to past periods will be regularized.
- 4. Imitation Zari Thread or Yarn: GST rate on imitation zari thread or yarn will be reduced from 12% to 5%, and payment of GST for past periods will be regularized.
- 5. Utility Vehicles: Entry 52B in the compensation cess notification will be amended to include all utility vehicles that meet specified parameters. The ground clearance in unladen condition will be clarified.
- 6. LD Slag: GST rate on LD slag will be reduced from 18% to 5% to promote better utilization and environmental protection.
- 7. Implants: Issues relating to trauma, spine, and arthroplasty implants prior to 18.07.2022 will be regularized due to genuine interpretational issues.
- 8. Fish Soluble Paste: GST rate on fish soluble paste will be reduced from 18% to 5%, and payment of GST for past periods will be regularized.
- 9. Desiccated Coconut: Issues relating to desiccated coconut for the period 1.7.2017 to 27.7.2017 will be regularized due to genuine interpretational issues.

- 10. Pan Masala and Tobacco Products: The earlier ad valorem rate applicable on 31st March 2023 will be notified for the levy of Compensation Cess on pan masala, tobacco products, etc., where it is not legally required to declare the retail sale price.
- 11. Banks for IGST Exemption: RBL Bank and ICBC Bank will be included in the list of specified banks eligible for IGST exemption on imports of gold, silver, or platinum. The list of eligible banks/entities will be updated as per the Foreign Trade Policy 2023.
- 12. Notifications: Consequential changes will be made in notifications in accordance with the new Foreign Trade Policy 2023.
- 13. Plates and Cups made of Areca Leaves: Issues relating to GST on plates and cups made of areca leaves prior to 01.10.2019 will be regularized.
- 14. Biomass Briquettes: Issues relating to GST on biomass briquettes for the period 01.7.2017 to 12.10.2017 will be regularized.

II. Recommendations relating to GST rates on Services:

A. Changes in GST rates of services:

 Satellite Launch Services: GST exemption on satellite launch services supplied by ISRO, Antrix Corporation Limited, and New Space India Limited (NSIL) may be extended to such services supplied by private sector organizations to encourage startups.

B. Other changes relating to services:

 Goods Transport Agencies (GTAs): GTAs will not be required to file a declaration for paying GST under forward charge every year. The option to pay GST under forward charge must be exercised by 31st March of the preceding financial year.





- 2. Services Provided by Directors: Services provided by a director of a company in his private or personal capacity, such as renting immovable property, will not be taxable under reverse charge mechanism (RCM). Only services supplied by a director in their capacity as a director of the company or body corporate will be taxable under RCM.
- Food and Beverages in Cinema Halls: Supply of food and beverages in cinema halls will be taxable as a restaurant service if supplied independently of the cinema exhibition service.

III. Second Report of Group of Ministers (GoM) on Casinos, Race Courses, and Online Gaming:

The GoM recommended taxing casinos, horse racing, and online gaming at a uniform rate of 28%, with tax applicable on the face value of chips purchased in the case of casinos, the full value of bets placed with bookmakers/totalisator in the case of horse racing, and the full value of bets placed in the case of online gaming.

United States holds title for world's most powerful military make new title

According to **Global Firepower**, a prominent data website specializing in defence-related information, the **United States** possesses the most powerful military force worldwide. **Russia and China** follow closely in second and third place, respectively, while **India secures the fourth position**. The recently released 2023 Military Strength list, which evaluates over 60 factors, also highlights nations with comparatively weaker military forces such as Bhutan and Iceland.

Assessment of the report:

The assessment by Global Firepower takes into account various criteria, including the number of military units, financial resources, logistical capabilities, and geographical considerations, to determine each nation's overall score. The report lists 145 countries and also compares each nation's year-on-year ranking changes.

- The top four nations remain as they were in the 2022 Global Firepower list. In a shift from the previous year's rankings, the United Kingdom has advanced from eighth to fifth place in terms of military strength. South Korea retains its sixth position from last year.
- Notably, Pakistan has entered the top 10, securing the seventh spot. Conversely, Japan and France, which held the fifth and seventh positions respectively last year, have dropped to eighth and ninth this year.






2023 Global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI)

The latest update of the **global Multidimensional Poverty Index** (MPI) highlights India's extraordinary achievement in poverty reduction. The country has lifted a staggering 415 million people out of poverty within a span of 15 years, demonstrating significant progress in improving living conditions. This article examines key highlights from the MPI report released by the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP) and the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative (OPHI).

India's Journey: From High Poverty Incidence to Impressive Decline:



In 2005/2006, India had a poverty incidence of 55.1%, with approximately 645 million people living in poverty.

- Through concerted efforts and effective policies, poverty rates have dropped to 16.4% in 2019/2021, showcasing substantial improvement in living conditions.
- The decline in poverty has been equal across regions and socio-economic groups, with the poorest states and groups experiencing the fastest progress.

Children and Rural Areas: Key Factors in Poverty Reduction:

 Children under 18 years old account for half of MPI-poor people, emphasizing the importance of addressing child poverty through comprehensive programs for their wellbeing, education, and access to essential services. Poverty predominantly affects rural areas, with 84% of the country's poor residing in these regions. This underscores the need for targeted measures to uplift rural communities and bridge the urban-rural divide.



- Globally, 1.1 billion people (18% of the total population) across 110 countries live in acute multidimensional poverty.
- Sub-Saharan Africa has 534 million poor, while South Asia has 389 million, making these regions home to approximately five out of every six poor people.
- Children under 18 years old account for 566 million MPIpoor people globally, with a poverty rate of 27.7%, compared to 13.4% among adults.

Outlook for India:

- Despite significant progress, India still has more than 230 million people living in poverty.
- The UNDP highlights the vulnerability of the population, with approximately 18.7% falling under the category of people who are not poor but have deprivations in 20-33.3% of all weighted indicators.








Improvement in Deprivation Indicators:

25 NATIONS HALVE GLOBAL MPI VALUES

- ➤ India is one of the 25 nations that have successfully halved their global Multidimensional Poverty Index values within 15 years
- ➤ In India, the incidence of poverty fell from 55% (645 million) in 2005/2006 to 16% (230 million) in 2019/2021
- ➤ People in India who are multi-dimensionally poor and
- deprived under the **nutrition** indicator declined from 44% in 2005-06 to 12% in 2019/21
- > Those who are poor & deprived of cooking fuel declined from 53% to 14% & those deprived of sanitation dipped from 50% to 11.3%
- ➤ In drinking water, those deprived fell from 16% to 3% & in housing from 44% to 14%
- India has shown significant progress in all three deprivation indicators: health, education, and standard of living.
- The percentage of people deprived of nutrition decreased from 44.3% in 2005/2006 to 11.8% in 2019/2021, and child mortality fell from 4.5% to 1.5%.

Recommendations:




- There is a need for context-specific multidimensional poverty indices that reflect national definitions of poverty.
- While the global MPI provides a standardized methodology, national definitions offer a comprehensive understanding of poverty specific to each country.
- It is crucial to consider these context-specific indices to evaluate and address poverty effectively.

About Global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI):

The Global Multidimensional Poverty Index (MPI) is a vital international resource designed to measure acute multidimensional poverty in over 100 developing countries. Launched in 2010 by the Oxford Poverty and Human Development Initiative (OPHI) and the Human Development Report Office of the United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), the MPI provides a comprehensive assessment of poverty beyond monetary measures.

Purpose and Scope: The MPI serves as a crucial tool to gauge the extent and nature of multidimensional poverty worldwide. It focuses on capturing various dimensions of poverty, including health, education, and standard of living, to provide a holistic understanding of people's well-being. It is applied across a broad range of developing countries, offering insights into the multifaceted challenges faced by different societies.

- Monitoring Deprivations: The MPI monitors deprivations in 10 key indicators that span the domains of health, education, and standard of living. These indicators are carefully selected to reflect the essential aspects of individuals' lives and well-being. By analyzing these indicators, the MPI provides a nuanced picture of poverty and identifies the specific areas where people face significant deprivations.
- 2. Incidence and Intensity of Poverty: The MPI considers both the incidence and intensity of poverty. A person is classified as multidimensionally poor if they are deprived in one-third or more (33% or more) of the weighted indicators out of the ten indicators. Those who face deprivations in half or more of the weighted indicators are considered to be living in extreme multidimensional poverty. This dual perspective helps to capture the severity and depth of poverty experienced by individuals and communities.

MPI Indicators and Dimensions: The MPI incorporates a diverse range of indicators and dimensions to comprehensively assess poverty. While the specific indicators may vary across countries, the following are commonly included:

- 1. Health Indicators:
 - Nutrition and food security
 - Child mortality
 - Access to healthcare





- 2. **Education Indicators:**
 - School attendance
 - Years of schooling completed
- Standard of Living Indicators:
 - Access to clean water and sanitation
 - Electricity and cooking fuel availability
 - Housing quality
 - Assets ownership

Chandrayaan-3: India's Mission to Soft-Land on the **Moon's South Pole**

Chandrayaan-3: India's Mission to Soft-Land on the Moon's South **Pole**

Chandrayaan-3 is India's third lunar mission, following the Chandrayaan-2 mission, with the goal of achieving a soft landing on the lunar surface and deploying a rover.


Chandrayaan-3 aims to showcase India's capabilities in landing and exploring the Moon's South Pole, a region known for the presence of water molecules.


Launch and Landing:



Chandrayaan-3 was successfully launched on July 14, 2023, from the Satish Dhawan Space Center in Sriharikota, Andhra Pradesh, using the Launch Vehicle Mark-III (LVM3).

- The spacecraft consists of a lander, a rover, and a propulsion module, collectively weighing 3,900 kg.
- The GSLV Mark 3 heavy-lift launch vehicle, also known as the Bahubali rocket, supports the moon lander Vikram.
- The craft is scheduled to touch down on the Moon's South Pole on August 23, following a journey lasting over 40 days.





Chandrayaan-3: India's Mission to Soft-Land on the Moon's South Pole

Objective:

The Chandrayaan-3 mission has three main objectives:

Safe and Soft Landing: The primary objective of Chandrayaan-3 is to achieve a safe and soft landing of the lander on the surface of the Moon. Learning from the previous mission's setback, this mission aims to successfully land the lander module on the lunar surface without any issues.








- Demonstration of Rover's Capabilities: Chandrayaan-3 aims to demonstrate the capabilities of the rover by showcasing its roaming and exploration abilities on the lunar surface. The rover will be deployed after the successful landing of the lander and will perform various scientific experiments and observations.
- In-Site Scientific Observations: The mission seeks to conduct in-site scientific observations and experiments to better understand the composition of the Moon. This includes analyzing the chemical and natural elements, soil, water, and other resources available on the lunar surface. These observations will contribute to expanding our knowledge of the Moon's composition and provide insights into the Moon's history and evolution.

Design:


Chandrayaan-3 consists of three main components:



Chandrayaan-3: India's Mission to Soft-Land on the Moon's South Pole

- **Propulsion Module:** The propulsion module is responsible for carrying the lander and rover configuration to the lunar orbit of 100 kilometers. It is a box-like structure with a large solar panel and an intermodular adapter cone that acts as a mounting structure for the lander. Additionally, it carries the SHAPE payload, which studies spectral and polarimetric measurements of Earth from the lunar orbit.
- **Lander:** The lander module is designed for a soft landing on the lunar surface. It has a box-shaped structure with four landing legs and four landing thrusters. The lander carries the rover and various scientific instruments for in-site analysis. It has undergone improvements in terms of structural rigidity, impact legs strength, instrumentation redundancy compared to its predecessor.

The lander carries three payloads:



Chandrayaan-3: India's Mission to Soft-Land on the Moon's South Pole

- Chandra's Surface Thermophysical **Experiment** Measures thermal conductivity (ChaSTE): temperature of the lunar surface.
- Instrument for Lunar Seismic Activity (ILSA): Measures seismic activity around the landing site.
- Langmuir Probe (LP): Estimates plasma density and its variations.
- Rover: The Chandrayaan-3 rover is a six-wheeled vehicle weighing 26 kilograms. It is equipped with scientific instruments, including cameras, spectrometers, and a drill. The rover has a range of 500 meters and is designed to communicate with the lander and the ground control team in India. Its expected lifespan is one lunar day, equivalent to 14 Earth days.

The rover aims to make significant scientific discoveries, including studying the lunar surface composition, detecting the presence of water ice in the lunar soil, investigating lunar impacts' history, and studying the Moon's atmosphere evolution.

Modifications and Precautions:

- Chandrayaan-3 has undergone modifications by ISRO to enhance reliability compared to its predecessor, Chandrayaan-2.
- The lander Vikram has been upgraded and carries additional fuel to ensure a successful landing and stay on the intended path to the lunar surface.
- The craft has undergone rigorous testing and incorporates numerous safety measures to increase the mission's chances of success.





Mission Components:

- The 3,900-kilogram Chandrayaan-3 spacecraft consists of three major modules: the Propulsion module, Lander module, and Rover.
- The lander, named Vikram, and the rover, named Pragyaan, are similar to their counterparts in Chandrayaan-2 but have undergone upgrades for improved reliability.
- The mission's budget is Rs. 615 crore.

National Affairs

- The DGFT (Directorate General of Foreign Trade) has issued a notification declaring that the import of potatoes from Bhutan will continue without the need for an import license until June 30, 2024. (Click here to read the article)
