<p>Canadian experts inspect Tirupati airport</p>	<p>In News: A team of representatives from Canadian Aviation visited the Tirupati International Airport at Renigunta to assess the feasibility of setting up a Maintenance, Repair, and Overhaul (MRO) center.</p> <p>Key Points:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • The team inspected the airport and discussed with Tirupati MP Dr M Gurumurthy regarding the venture. • The Canadian aviation team is preparing to submit their proposals to the Centre for the establishment of the MRO center. • The Aviation Ministry identified sites for implementation of MRO at eight airports across the country. • But as of now, it was proposed to take up the works at Tirupati airport in the second phase. <p>Did you Know? Terms of References approved for Inter-state Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal



In News:

The Union Cabinet gave its nod for the terms of reference of Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal (KWDT).

Key facts

- The decision has been taken under Inter State River Water Disputes Act, 1956 for its adjudication between the States of Telangana and Andhra Pradesh.
- Tribunal will allocate water on a project-wise basis for projects in both states
- Under new terms of reference the tribunal will divide the water of the Krishna River among both states
- Earlier, the tenure of Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal was extended till March 31, 2024 on the request of the tribunal.

About Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal

About Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal:

- The Krishna Water Disputes Tribunal (KWDT) is a quasi-judicial body.
- it is set up under the Inter-State River Water Disputes Act, 1956,
- It is to adjudicate disputes over the sharing of Krishna river waters among the riparian states of Maharashtra, Karnataka, Andhra Pradesh, and Telangana.
- The KWDT was first constituted in 1969, but its report was not finalized until 1973.

Bamboo cultivation in AP and TS

In News:

Farmers from Andhra and Telangana started showing interest in Bamboo cultivation

Key facts

- Bamboo is being made a horticulture crop and an anchoring unit was set by the concerned department last year in the State.



- Due to horticulture declaration the farmers are inclining towards the cultivation of bamboo.
- As of now, Bamboo has been cultivated in **around 200 acres of land in both the Telugu states** as more farmers have been showing interest to grow it.
- **Bamboo prefers well-drained soils with a pH of 6.0-7.0.**
- Bamboo can be propagated from seeds, rhizomes, culm cuttings, or clump division

Praja Arogya Vedika shows concern over rampant diseases in Andhra Pradesh



In News:

The Praja Arogya Vedika has drawn the attention of the Andhra Pradesh government to the prevalence of diseases such as Malaria, Dengue, and various viral fevers.

Key Points:

- President and General Secretary of the vedika told AP CM that the spread of Malaria cases has increased by over 200% compared to previous years.
- Dengue cases had risen by more than 50%, posing a severe risk to the public health landscape of AP.
