#### **Delimitation Commission**

#### **Key points:**

- A Delimitation Commission is a high-powered body appointed by the Central Government of India to redraw boundaries territorial the of constituencies in the country.
- Delimitation is the process of fixing the limits or boundaries of electoral constituencies in a country or a state.
- It is done to ensure that all constituencies have approximately equal populations, so that each vote has equal weight.
- The **Delimitation Commission is appointed under** the Delimitation Act, which is passed by Parliament after every census.
- The Act specifies the factors that the Commission must take into account when redrawing constituency boundaries, such as population, geographical features, and administrative boundaries.
- The Delimitation Commission is an independent body, and its orders are final and cannot be challenged in court.
- This is because delimitation is a sensitive process, and the Commission needs to be free from any political interference.


