<p><b>International Migrants Day</b></p> 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>International Migrants Day is celebrated on <b>18 December</b>.</li> <li>On this International Migrants Day, IOM aims to <b>position migration as one of the solutions to global challenges</b>, such as adapting to the impacts of climate change or providing better economic opportunities for communities.</li> <li>The theme for the 2023 is "<b>Act today for a better tomorrow for all: Improving the health of migrants to unleash the power of migration</b>"</li> </ul>
<p><b>Data on Foreign tourist visits</b></p>	<p><b>Context</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>There has been a significant <b>increase in the number of foreign tourists visiting India in 2023</b> with a footfall of <b>7.24 million</b> till October compared with <b>6.44 million</b> for the corresponding period in 2022.</li> <li>This is an <b>increase of 55.6%</b></li> <li>The numbers though are still below the pre-pandemic levels.</li> <li>In 2018 and 2019, India saw <b>10.56 million and 10.93 million foreign tourist arrivals</b>, respectively, which dipped to 2.74 million in 2020 and further to 1.52 million in 2021, majorly due to the COVID-induced lockdown.</li> </ul> <p><b>Schemes for Financial assistance</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li><b>Swadesh Darshan 2</b> is the flagship scheme of the <b>Ministry of Tourism</b> which provides financial assistance to the State governments and Union Territories and Central agencies for the development of tourism infrastructure at various destinations.</li> <li>The <b>Prasad (Pilgrimage Rejuvenation And Spiritual Augmentation Drive)</b> scheme focuses on developing and identifying pilgrimage sites across India to promote religious tourism.</li> <li>It aims to <b>integrate pilgrimage destinations</b> in a prioritised, planned and sustainable manner to provide a complete religious tourism experience.</li> <li>The growth of domestic tourism hugely depends on pilgrimage tourism.</li> </ul>

First winter Arctic expedition



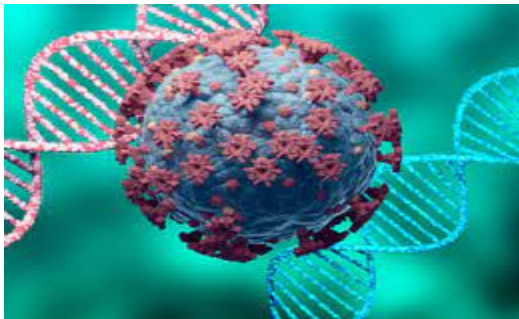
Context

- The **Raman Research Institute (RRI)** is participating in the **first winter Indian expedition to the Arctic region.**
- The institute researchers would examine the characterisation of the radio frequency environment in the **Svalbard region of the Arctic in Norway.**
- The survey will **help astronomers assess the suitability of this uniquely located region** for carrying out precision astronomy measurements.

Key points

- India has been running its own research station, **Himadri, in Svalbard since 2008.**
- The winter expedition is a bid to maintain a year-long presence at the station.
- The month-long scientific expedition is being funded by the **Earth Sciences Ministry.**
- The **National Centre for Polar and Ocean Research, Goa,** is the nodal agency spearheading the expedition

JN.1 variant



Context

- The Union Health Ministry has asked all States to maintain a constant vigilance over the COVID-19 situation in the country in view of the upcoming festive season and the recent surge in cases in some parts of the country.
- The alert comes following the detection of the country's first case of the new **JN.1 variant of COVID-19 in Kerala.**

E-bus penetration in India

Context

- **CRISIL report** on E-bus penetration in India was released recently
- The share of electric buses in new bus sales across **India is expected to double to 8% next fiscal from 4% in the last fiscal.**
- It is driven by the central government's focus on decarbonising the public transport sector and favourable **total cost of ownership (TCO)** for an e-bus vis-à-vis buses run on other fuels

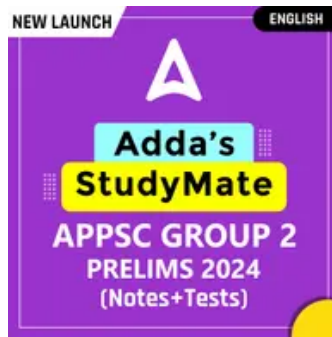
