Context:

- World Wetlands Day is celebrated annually on February 2nd
- It aims to raise global awareness about the vital role of wetlands for both people and the planet.
- It also commemorates the signing of the Ramsar Convention on Wetlands in 1971, an international treaty for the conservation and wise use of wetlands.
- The theme for 2024 is: "Wetlands and Human Wellbeing"
- It focuses on the interconnectedness between wetlands and various aspects of human wellbeing, including physical, mental and environmental health

About:

- Wetlands are ecosystems where water saturates the land for extended periods, creating unique habitats for diverse plants and animals.
- Examples include marshes, swamps, bogs, mangroves, and even rice paddies.

Did you Know?

- The state of Tamil Nadu (14) has the most Ramsar sites in India, followed by the state of Uttar Pradesh with 10 sites.
- India currently has 80 sites designated as **Wetlands** of International Importance (Ramsar Sites).

SCR gets ₹14,232 crore; to spend ₹4,089 crore on doubling, new lines this year

Context:

- The South Central Railway (SCR) has been allocated ₹14,232 crore in the current year's budget, marking a significant investment in India's railway infrastructure.
- A substantial portion of this budget (₹4,089 crore) is earmarked for doubling existing lines and constructing new railway lines, aiming to improve connectivity and cater to growing passenger and freight demands.









	Other key areas of focus include track renewals, road over and under bridges, and passenger amenities, reflecting a holistic approach to infrastructure development and enhancing the travel experience.
Telangana, A.P. handover Krishna water management to River Board	Telangana and Andhra Pradesh agreed to hand over the operational control of 15 projects on the Krishna River, including the crucial Srisailam and Nagarjunasagar projects, to the Krishna River Management Board (KRMB). This marks a significant development in resolving the long-standing water dispute between the two states. About: Water release management: KRMB will now be responsible for regulating water releases from the 15 projects and the spillways of the two major reservoirs. This aims to ensure more equitable and transparent water sharing between the states. Operation and maintenance: However, the operation and maintenance of the projects will continue to be handled by the respective states - Srisailam by Andhra Pradesh and Nagarjunasagar by Telangana. Hydropower generation: The decision on managing the hydroelectric units at the projects remains unresolved. Both states will continue to operate them independently for now.
