
State transferring nearly ₹1 lakh crore under welfare scheme	 Andhra Pradesh govt spent about 4.2 lakh crore under various direct benefit transfer (DBT) schemes and non-DBT schemes ever since it assumed office in 2019. This means that the state is transferring nearly 1 lakh crore under these schemes to the beneficiaries every year. For instance, the Amma Vodi scheme extends 15,000 annual financial help to the mothers, who send their wards to the schools and colleges. About 26,000 crore was spent on this scheme alone in the last four years, benefiting more than 83 lakh students of classes I to intermediate
7,500 students benefited from 35% quota	 Andhra Pradesh amended its Private Universities Act in 2021, reserving 35% of seats in private universities under state govt quota. This initiative has benefited nearly 7,500 students in the last three years, gaining them admission into private universities like SRM and VIT. Alao, the state government sets the fees for these seats Andhra Pradesh is the first state to introduce the 35% government quota in private universities.
