It was launched in 2015, and the initiative targets children aged 1-19 years, both enrolled and non-enrolled in schools, through platforms like schools and Anganwadi centers. Theme of National Deworming Day 2024 is "Eliminate STH: Invest in a healthier future for children" It revolves around public health, with a specific focus on preventing and controlling parasitic worm infections, particularly in children Significance: Reduces worm infections: Soil-transmitted helminths (intestinal worms) are prevalent in India, leading to health issues like anemia, malnutrition, impaired cognitive development, and reduced school attendance. NDD tackles this by mass deworming children. Improves overall health: By eliminating worms, NDD improves children's overall health, nutritional status, and quality of life, contributing to better educational outcomes and future potential.




