Telangana Govt Released Input subsidy to Farmers	 Context: The Telangana government has taken a proactive step to support farmers affected by crop damage caused by heavy rains and hailstorms between March 16 and 21, 2024. An amount of Rs.15.81 crore has been released from the State Disaster Response Fund to provide one-time relief to farmers in 10 districts where agriculture and horticulture crops suffered significant losses.
	 Input Subsidy: Under this scheme, farmers in the 10 affected districts, including Kamareddy, Nizamabad, Rajanna Sircilla, Siddipet, Medak, Adilabad, Nirmal, Mancherial, Karimnagar, and Sangareddy, will receive a relief of Rs.10,000 per acre for crop losses. With the Model Code of Conduct (MCC) in effect due to the Lok Sabha elections, necessary permission has been obtained from the Election Commission of India (ECI) for the disbursement of funds. A total of 10,328 acres, covering 9,107 farmers, have been impacted in Kamareddy alone, highlighting the widespread nature of the crop damage.

Telangana government release Rythu Bandhu	 Context: The state government disbursed Rythu Bandhu amounts totaling Rs. 2,200 crore to farmers who own five or more acres of land. This move comes after receiving approval from the Election Commission, enabling the timely distribution of financial assistance to eligible beneficiaries. Rythu bandhu: Under the Rythu Bandhu scheme, a total of Rs. 5.5K crore has already been disbursed to 64.75 lakh farmers by March 28. This initiative aims to provide financial support to farmers ahead of the Rabi crop season. The government has prioritized the disbursement of funds to farmers owning five or less acres of land, constituting 92% of eligible beneficiaries. With the recent release of Rs. 2,200 crore, the remaining 8%, or approximately 4.5 lakh farmers, have now received the benefits under

	 the Rythu Bandhu scheme for Rabi crops. This scheme aims to enhance the input subsidy amount from Rs. 10,000 to Rs. 15,000 per acre for two crops, further supporting the agricultural sector in the state. The Rythu Bandhu scheme (Agriculture Investment Support Scheme), initiated by the Telangana government in 2018, provides financial support to farmers through direct transfers of Rs 5,000 per acre per season, covering both kharif and rabi harvests. Under the scheme, funds are directly deposited into farmers' accounts, with an initial allocation of Rs 12,000 crore from the state budget.
	 Farmers Suicides In 2019, Telangana reported the fourth-highest number of farmer suicides in India, according to the National Crime Records Bureau (NCRB). The report reveals that 491 farmers in the state took their own lives that year. Among them, 373 were cultivating their own lands, while 118 were farming leased lands. 908 cases reported in 2018 851 Cases in 2017 645 Cases in 2016. According to recent data, the city has witnessed a 20% rise in the number of patents filed in the last five years, reflecting its growing prominence in the global innovation landscape. S&T in Telangana: The Telangana State Council of Science & Technology (TSCOST) executed the Mapping of S&T Needs of the State (MSTN) project. Sectors covered by MSTN include Environment, Energy, Rural Development, Agriculture, Education, and Health TSCOST acts as the focal point for formulating, planning, coordinating, and promoting S&T activities in Telangana.
