AP may face high temperature amid cyclone 'Remal' formation	 Andhra Pradesh is expected to see rising daytime temperatures over the next five days. This is due to a low-pressure system forming in the Bay of Bengal, likely cyclone Remal. Remal is not expected to bring significant rainfall, instead causing dry weather and high temperatures. The state's main concern is the heatwave, with some areas already exceeding 40 degrees Celsius. The cyclone's impact on the monsoon's arrival remains uncertain. About Cyclone Remal: Cyclone Remal is classified as a Severe Cyclone. It is developing in the Bay of Bengal and is expected to make landfall on the West Bengal coast near Kolkata by Sunday, May 26th. Wind speeds are forecast to reach 110-120 kmph with gusts up to 135 kmph. Heavy rainfall is predicted for West Bengal and parts of Bangladesh. The cyclone is forecast to track northeastward
Bhavitha centres	towards Bangladesh and West Bengal, bringing heavy rainfall there. Context: Palnadu district officials, AP are conducting door-to-door surveys from May 1 to June 9 to identify children with special needs and enroll them in Bhavitha centers. About: These centers aim to equip children with skills for independence and provide them with: Education: Support for academic success in mainstream schools. Therapies: Physiotherapy, speech therapy, and psychological services. Accessibility: Resources to overcome learning barriers. The survey, conducted by Inclusive Education Resource People (IERPs), has already identified and enrolled 75 children.

About:

- Tallapaka Annamacharya, also known as Annamayya, was a Telugu saint-poet, musician, and composer who lived from 1408 to 1503.
- He is revered as the "Father of Carnatic Music" for his pioneering contributions to the development of this classical music form.
- Annamacharya's devotional songs are known as sankirtana
- **They** are infused with profound spiritual insights and captivating melodies, making them a cornerstone of Telugu culture and Carnatic music repertoire.

About:

- This site, also known as Sriparvata-Vijayapuri, was an ancient capital city and a major Buddhist center during the Ikshwaku rule in the 3rd century CE.
