Aurangazeb era coins	 Context: MNREGS workers made a remarkable discovery in Siddipet, unearthing 20 silver coins and two rings from the Aurangazeb era, the sixth Mughal emperor. Key points: The discovery was made at an agricultural field in Narsaipally village of Maddur mandal. The coins and rings were found packed in a rock-made box. Historian BV Badragirish revealed that the coins, minted between 1670 and 1690, were one rupee coins from Surat, Zafrabad (current Bidar), and Golkonda Mints. During Aurangzeb's rule, Bidar town was renamed Zafrabad but reverted to its original name after his demise. Considering Aurangzeb's completion of the conquest of South India in 1687, coins from Golkonda Mint would likely have been minted after this date. The rings found with the coins were used to wear coins, a practice observed among several tribes until recent times. Burying valuables to protect them from bandits was common practice, explaining their discovery over 350 years later.
	 Badshah" in Persian, with Holy Quran verses on the reverse. Each coin weighed approximately 11.36 grams, according to archeology enthusiast Kolipaka Srinivas.
Historical significance of the Kakatiya Thoranam and Charminar in Telangana emblem	 Context: Despite their historical significance, the Congress-led administration, under Chief Minister Revanth Reddy, plans to unveil a new emblem on Telangana Formation Day, arguing that the current emblem, featuring the Kakatiya Kala Thoranam and Charminar, symbolizes feudalism and autocratic rule. This decision has raised concerns among historians and cultural enthusiasts, who fear that it might lead to the erasure of Telangana's rich history and cultural identity. The existing emblem, adopted in 2014 and designed by artist Laxman Aelay, is adorned in green and gold, symbolizing "Bangaru Telangana" or "Golden Telangana."

	 About: The historical significance of the Kakatiya Thoranam and Charminar in the Telangana emblem is deeply rooted in the region's rich heritage. The Kakatiya Kala Thoranam, also known as the Warangal Gate, is an architectural marvel from the 12th century, symbolizing the artistic excellence of the Kakatiya dynasty. This grand stone arch, once part of the Swayambhusiva temple complex in Warangal Fort, reflects the dynasty's patronage of art, literature, and architecture, which significantly influenced Telangana's cultural landscape. On the other hand, the Charminar, built in 1591, stands as a testament to Hyderabad's heritage. This iconic monument, with its four towering minarets, was constructed to celebrate the founding of Hyderabad and the eradication of a plague that had ravaged the region. Together, these monuments represent the diverse cultural and historical influences that have shaped Telangana over centuries.
Cyber Lab D4C	 Context: A new office for the Cyber Lab D4C (District Cyber Crime Coordination Centre) was inaugurated at the SP office in Sangareddy.
	 About: The initiative aims to enhance the performance of the IT Cell and Cyber Cell by co-locating them. Cyber Lab will also provide training to constables dealing with cyber crimes and IT in all police stations across the district. This move is expected to bolster cybercrime prevention and investigation efforts.
SCCL Pioneers Solar Power at New Heights in Ramagundam	 Context: The Singareni Collieries Company Limited (SCCL) is pioneering the establishment of a unique solar power generation unit at an impressive height of 120 meters, atop the Over Burden (OB) of opencast-I coal mine in Ramagundam-III area, Peddapalli district. This innovative 22 MW plant comes at a cost of Rs 126 crore, with an expenditure of Rs 5 crore per 1MW of solar power generated.

	 Key points: The solar plant, a first of its kind on the OB of OCP-I, is particularly symbolic as OCP-I is set to celebrate its 50th anniversary in October. Currently, a 50 MW unit sprawls across 250 acres in OCP-I, with plans to bolster RG-III's solar power generation capacity to 100 MW by 2025-26. With the implementation of solar power initiatives, SCCL has managed to save Rs 4 crore this year and Rs 7 crore last year, indicating a positive trend towards reducing power expenditure.
Amrabad tiger reserve	 Context: Chief Secretary Santhi Kumari of Telangana has set a deadline of July-end to make the Amrabad Tiger Reserve a plastic-free zone. Key points: Nestled within Telangana's Nallamala hills, the Amrabad Tiger Reserve holds the distinction of being India's second-largest, surpassed only by its neighbor, the Nagarjunasagar Srisailam Tiger Reserve spanning Andhra Pradesh and Telangana. This rich ecosystem boasts remarkable biodiversity. Over 600 plant species provide sustenance for a vibrant animal community, with around 70 mammal species, over 300 bird varieties, and 60 reptile species calling this reserve home. Additionally, the Chenchu tribe has a significant presence within the reserve.
