The recent confirmation of the world's first human fatality due to avian influenza (H5N2) in Mexico, along with ongoing outbreaks in Indian states like Andhra Pradesh and Kerala, underscores the need for proactive measures to control the spread of the virus. About: Highly contagious viral infection affecting birds, both wild and domestic. Notably includes the highly pathogenic avian influenza H5N1 strain. H5N1 Virus: First identified in domestic waterfowl in Southern China in 1996. Transmission to Humans: Human infections are rare and difficult to transmit person-to-person. WHO reports a mortality rate of about 60% for infected individuals. Symptoms range from mild (fever, cough, muscle aches) to severe (pneumonia, difficulty breathing, cognitive issues like altered mental status and seizures). Avian Influenza in India: Control Measures: India's "detect and cull" policy as per the National Action Plan for Prevention, Control, and Containment of Avian Influenza (revised - 2021).
Amrabad Tiger Reserve	 Context: The State Forest Department, following the successful relocation of 94 families from the Kawal Tiger Reserve (KTR) last year, is now preparing to relocate approximately 415 families from the Amrabad Tiger Reserve (ATR). This move aims to free up around 1192 hectares of forest land, enhancing conservation efforts. Key points:











	 The Amrabad Tiger Reserve which is part of the Nallamala Forest track has rich Biological Diversity with several endemic species of flora and fauna. This Forest tract is home to the largest number of Tigers in Telangana. The hilly terrain of this Tiger Reserve with deep valleys and gorges forms the catchment of the Krishna River. This Tiger Reserve (ATR) is one of the largest tiger reserves in India that extends about 2611.4 Sq Km over Nagarkurnool and Nalgonda districts of Telangana Amrabad Tiger Reserve a well-known and well-preserved nature reserve in Nallamala Hills, part of the Eastern Ghats chain. This is the second-largest Tiger Reserve in terms of core area but the sixth-largest tiger reserve in the sixth-largest in India. The reserve was notified as a sanctuary in the year 1983 and after the bifurcation of Telugu States in 2014, it was declared as Amarabad Tiger Reserve. It lies in the three forest divisions of Amarabad, Achampet in Nagarkurnool district, and Nagarjunsagar division in Nalgonda district.
Naryanpet-Kodangal lift irrigation scheme	 Context: The Telangana state government has decided to expedite the Narayanapet-Kodangal Lift Irrigation Scheme. Key points: The estimated cost of the Narayanpet-Kodangal Lift Irrigation Scheme is around Rs 4,350 crore, and it will be constructed in two phases. Chief Minister A Revanth Reddy laid the foundation for this project in February this year. The project will source water from the Bhutpur reservoir, lifting it to the Vutkur tank. From there, it will be further lifted to the Jayamma tank and then to the Kankurthy tank. The government plans to spend Rs 2,945 crore on the first phase, which includes modernizing the Vutkur, Jayamma, and Kankurthy tanks. This project aims to provide irrigation water to one lakh acres across Narayanpet, Kodangal, and Makthal Assembly segments, as well as the Narayanpet district.
