Nagarajunasagar Srisailam Tiger Reserve	 Context: Forest Department officials are working to improve prey density in the Nagarajunasagar Srisailam Tiger Reserve (NSTR), Andhra Pradesh.
	 Prey Animals Relocation: To support tiger cubs, officials are increasing the population of herbivorous animals. Relocated 15 spotted deer and 28 sambars from a private zoo by Nagarjuna Fertilisers in Kakinada to Nallamala forest area.
	 NSTR: Largest among India's 53 tiger reserves. Spread over five districts: Nandyal, Prakasam, Palnadu in Andhra Pradesh, Nalgonda, and Mahabubnagar in Telangana. Total area: 3,728 sq km; core area: 1,200 sq km. Home to approximately 73 Bengal Tigers.
State Government's Initiative: Nenu Badiki Pota	 Objective: Ensure 100% student enrollment by identifying and enrolling school dropouts and out-of-school children.
	Duration: June 13 to July 12.
	Target Group: Children aged 6 to 14 years.
	 Implementation: Under the guidance of Samagra Shiksha. Village, mandal, and district-level committees established. Home visits by village volunteers, parents committee members, and community leaders to identify non-enrolled children.
	 Activities: Educational awareness campaigns conducted daily as per Samagra Shiksha's schedule. Focus on enrolling all children within the specified age group.
	Special Focus: Emphasis on the enrollment and education of girls.

Special Tiger Corridor to Connect Nallamala and Seshachalam Forests	 Context: The Forest Department in Andhra Pradesh is developing a special corridor to connect the Nallamala and Seshachalam forests, aiming to facilitate the movement of tigers. This initiative marks a significant effort to reintroduce tigers to the Seshachalam area, where they have been absent for nearly a century.
	 Increasing Tiger Activity and Conservation Efforts: Officials have observed that tigers frequently visit the Seshachalam forest before returning to Nallamala. Due to the rising tiger activity between the Nellore and Kadapa districts, the Forest Department has expedited plans to establish the corridor, submitting proposals to the Centre for approval. This corridor will provide a safe passage for tigers, enhancing their protection and conservation in Andhra Pradesh.
	 Corridor Coverage and Training: The proposed corridor will cover approximately 1.50 lakh hectares within the Venkatagiri, Atmakur, Rapur, and Udayagiri ranges of the undivided Nellore district. It will span across four districts, including nearly 4 lakh hectares of forest area in Nellore, Tirupati, Kadapa, and Prakasam.
