Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Samhitha	 Context: Nirmal district registered its first case under the newly implemented Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Samhitha. About: Diagonal district registered its first case under the newly implemented Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha Samhitha.
	 The Bharatiya Nagarik Suraksha (Second) Sanhita, 2023 (BNSS2) introduces significant changes to the existing Criminal Procedure Code, 1973 (CrPC).
	 Timelines: Strict timelines have been introduced under the BNSS2 to ensure timely processing of cases. Medical reports for rape victims must be completed within 7 days, judgments within 30 days (extendable to 45 days), victim progress updates within 90 days, and charge framing within 60 days from the first hearing.
Places in News : Basar	 Context: The Sri Gnana Saraswathi Devasthanam in Basar, which oversees South India's only Saraswathi temple, is currently facing significant administrative challenges.
	 About: The Gnana Saraswathi Temple is situated on the banks of the Godavari River in Basara village, Adilabad, Telangana. Basar is one of the only two Saraswathi temples(the other being Sharada Peeth in Kashmir) in India, attracting parents from Telangana, Maharashtra, Karnataka, and Tamil Nadu for the Aksharabhyasam ceremony.
Anti Defection Law	 Context: Former Vice President M. Venkaiah Naidu, emphasized the urgent need for amending the 10th Schedule of the Constitution, pointing out significant loopholes that allow elected representatives to defect from one political party to another without consequence.
	 Key points: He proposed that politicians wishing to change their party affiliations should first resign from their current posts, rather than switch parties while in office, citing the need for greater accountability and respect for democratic norms.

	 Naidu also advocated for each political party to establish and uphold its own code of conduct for members and leaders, promoting ethical standards within the political landscape.
	About:
	 The anti-defection law deals with situations of defection in Parliament or state legislatures by: (a) members of a political party, (b) independent members, and (c) nominated members. In political scenario it is a situation when a member of a political party leaves his party and joins hands with other parties A Member could be disqualified: If he or she voluntarily gives up the membership of a political party or joins any other political party after the election, votes or abstains from any crucial voting contrary to the
	 directive circulated by his/her respective political party. A nominated member if he/she joins any political party after six months from the date he/she takes his seat. Chairman or the Speaker of the House have absolute power in deciding the cases pertaining to disqualification of members on the ground of defection.
Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services	 Context: The Indian National Centre for Ocean Information Services (INCOIS) has launched the Synergistic Ocean Observation Prediction Services (SynOPS), a pioneering facility dedicated to monitoring and analyzing ocean conditions. INCOIS plans to expand its services by introducing marine heatwave warnings, coral bleaching advisories, and water quality advisories in Kochi and Vizag.
	 Synergistic Ocean Observation Prediction Services (SynOPS): This initiative, inaugurated in February, utilizes real-time data collected from in situ ocean sensors and remote sensing technologies. The data is processed to offer a wide range of services including marine fisheries advisories, early tsunami warnings, storm surge alerts, coral bleaching advisories, and marine heatwave warnings. SynOPS employs advanced 2D and 3D modeling systems to forecast oceanic parameters such as sea

 surface currents, temperatures, wind speeds, and conditions like El Nino and La Nina. This information is crucial for various stakeholders
 including the Indian Navy, Coast Guards, and 26 nations bordering the Indian Ocean, enhancing preparedness against natural disasters like earthquakes and tsunamis. These efforts are part of broader collaborations with agencies like the India Meteorological Department (IMD) to enhance disaster management capabilities, including the development of 3D building maps for assessing flood risks in coastal areas prone to cyclones.
