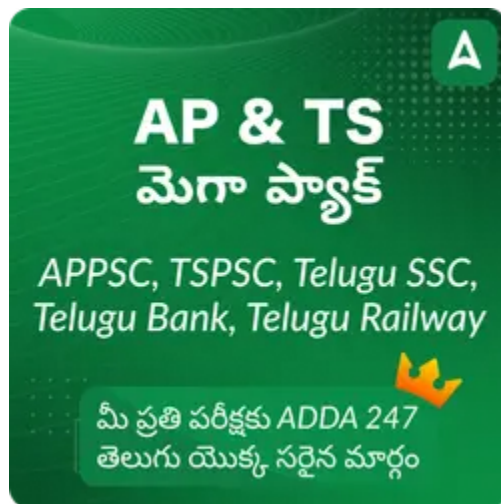
Nutritional Gardens	<p>Context:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> In an innovative move, district authorities in Krishna district, Andhra Pradesh, under the leadership of Collector DK Balaji, have launched a project to establish organic nutritional kitchen gardens in 100 schools.
